

The Parochial Church Council have joined the Eco-Church scheme this year and have recently approved a mowing regime that will encourage wildflowers and wildlife, whilst maintaining access to all tended graves and balancing the need for a tidy appearance with the benefits to nature. This was devised with assistance from the Norfolk Wildlife Trust.

We desperately need volunteers from the local community to assist us with this. The more people that help, the quicker and easier the job will get done. If you can spare an hour or two on that day, please join us in the churchyard on Saturday 17th September at 10am. If you have a strimmer and/or a rake, please bring it along. Refreshments will be provided, and toilets are available in the church.

Patient Survey

Please see a summary infographic (on page 18) giving details of a recent patient survey which has been undertaken by the NHS which shows details of our performance Vs the National Average and the local ICS (Integrated Care System, formerly known as the CCG Clinical Commissioning Group for Norfolk & Waveney)

We are very pleased with the feedback received. We know we have areas to improve and are doing our absolute best to work hard and provide a robust and reliable service to our patients in and around the Long Stratton and Newton Flotman area.


We are working hard to improve the accessibility to the Practice as the first slide clearly shows that this is the area requiring focus.

We have appointed another Nurse Practitioner who starts with us this week (04.08.22), and are actively seeking to recruit another GP to our team. We are also working with system providers to give a multi-channel option for booking appointments and interacting with the surgery other than by telephone.

Healthwatch recently conducted a much more localised survey, and we await the findings of that with anticipation when they report back to our Patient Participation Group. However, picking out some of the highlights we would like to recognise the fact that the "Helpfulness of Receptionists" score came out as 90% Vs the National Average of 82% and the ICS average of 84%.


The second of the 2 charts is probably where we gained most satisfaction because EVERY category measured scored higher than the NHS National average and the local ICS average, and these figures represent the experience that patients have during their appointment. *For more information visit https://www.gp-patient.co.uk/.*

We know that our staff sickness has had a significant impact on our service over recent months. We too have been affected by COVID and the rise in infection and, because of the work we do with vulnerable people, we have to isolate away from work for longer periods which creates pressure on appointment availability, which is critical at the moment. Please remember, we catch infections the same way as anyone else, and the risk of spreading infection to others is far higher in a GP surgery so please help us by wearing a face covering at all times when you come into the surgery, use the sanitiser provided and help us keep you all safe and well.





Early Childhood and Family Service

It was just after 10am on a bright sunny day in Central London on Friday 9 July 1869 when a tall man wearing a black frock coat and carrying a top hat turned the handle and opened the door of 8 Church Street, Lambeth and entered.

His name was Thomas Bowman Stephenson and he was 29 years old. He was taking possession of the first of many Children's Homes. Earlier in the year two friends of Thomas Stephenson, Francis Horner and Alfred Mager, had shown Stephenson the plight of homeless children around Lambeth who were neglected, shoeless, ragged and miserable. Together they recognised that street children needed a safe home and within only a few months were successful in raising the funds to rent the Church Street property. Thus began this great children's charity, subsequently named the National Children's Home (NCH) which became Action for Children in 2008.

Thomas Stephenson was the son of a Methodist Preacher and was born in Newcastle in 1839. His childhood was a very loving but austere one as the family struggled financially. Thomas, unsurprisingly, followed his father into the Methodist Church and started his life as a Preacher at St Peter's Chapel in Lady Lane, Norwich.

Our founder is often seen as a middle-aged philanthropist and a typical Victorian gentleman however nothing could be further from the truth. Thomas was a charismatic personality - young, energetic and a real 'trendsetter'. He left Norwich and went north to Lancashire and it was here that his attention was first drawn to the welfare of children who were working in the cotton mills. He championed their cause, drawing attention to the poor and dangerous working conditions in the Mills.

His preaching and new modern ideas attracted the attention of a chapel in London who 'head-hunted' him to help their struggling congregation. He developed an openair service and with his fine baritone voice, his singing drew in large crowds. He was a young, dynamic man who had a clear vision of what needed to be done.

150 years later problems/hardships still exist for families and children in a similar way to Stephenson's pioneering project. We at Action For Children continue to support houses which accommodate and support homeless young people across the country. 

Weston family of Park and Grange Farms

In 1786 William Weston married Mary Reeve at Kenninghall and from 1788 they rented Wacton Hall and farm, then in 1795 when Mary's father died she inherited one seventh of his estate. Presumably she used some of that inheritance to buy Park Farm in 1809.

They had 11 children, two of whom died in infancy. Of the others who all married, Mary married Samuel Gardiner in 1826, who subsequently bought Grange Farm, and William jnr who married Mary Neave in 1829, the same year as his father William died

On his marriage William rents Grange Farm from his brother-in-law, Samuel Gardiner, leaving his mother Mary and younger brother, John Reeve occupying Park Farm.

In 1836 it was reported in the Norwich Chronicle of 27th August that some miscreant had entered the stables (now converted to a dwelling) of William Weston and after cutting several harness barbarously wounded two valuable horses. This was at the time a period of civil unrest due to the imposition of new Poor Laws in 1834, resulting in the building of the workhouse at Pulham and the transfer to there of Wacton's poor. William Weston was one of the Overseers of the Poor for Wacton who sold Wacton's poor cottages in 1837.

Despite this set back William manager to buy Grange Farm on mortgage in 1842. William and Mary live at Grange Farm throughout their married life but had no children.

Meanwhile only John Reeve remains unmarried at his mothers death in 1840, and he took over Park farm from her and employed a housekeeper. Then in March 1855 he marries Harriet Chapple, daughter of a Tharston farmer, by licence at Wacton. In August of that year Martha, their daughter is baptised but the Rector records her as Martha Weston Chapple, mother a single woman, as her birth was registered in June the previous year.

When William dies intestate in 1859, the farm passed to his brother John Reeve Weston, heir at law and who remortgages for £2000. John Reeve Weston who lived in Park Farm house then lets Grange Farm to Robert Fisher.

John Reeve Weston and Martha have five children, viz. Martha Chapple, William John, John Reeve, Mary and Frances Elizabeth. In his will John Reeve instructs his executors to sell Grange Farm, which they did, and that his wife Harriet had Park Farm for life or widowhood, then William John was to be offered first refusal to purchase Park Farm, if not the property was to be sold and the monies from both sales to be divided between his children. John Reeve died in 1869.

Now things get interesting, in 1872 Martha elopes to London with George Talbot and married there (more about that in a future story). Frances died at home in 1896 at the age of 30. John Reeve fails to return from a drinking session at the Safety Valve pub next to Forncett Station in December 1902. He is found drowned in a pond the next day, an inquest returned a verdict of accidental death. William John, as far as I can find, disappears after the 1881 Census where he is described as a 25 year old farmer's son. Mary never marries and lives at home with her mother running Park Farm.

Harriet died in 1918 when she left £300 to her daughter Mary and £300 to her grandson John Clement Talbot, son of her sister Martha. Thus it appears Park Farm was never sold but held by the executors on trust for the benefit of the surviving children of John Reeve Weston, now apparently only Mary left.

Mary continued to run the farm, with the help of John Clement until the summer of 1936 when he married Maria Gladys Smith in London but John Clement died in October 1936. Mary continued to run the farm until 1949 when she died intestate. The farm then passed to the children of Martha Talbot, the only child of John Reeve who has children.

Four alpacas came to greet us at a field gate where the damsons were fruiting but we didn't feed them.

We turned right at the sharp corner on Wood Lane and along a field edge away from Swardeston. We could just see the big new houses being built where Bobbin Brothers Farm shop had been. The path zig-zagged through leafy sugar beet and over a lane.



Pylons loomed overhead and reminded us that the Norwich electric substation was close by before we turned down a cool wooded path and savoured the plentiful blackberries. Large white butterflies were dancing among the thistles.

Coming back to Gowthorpe Lane we wandered along a bit before the tower of The Vale in Swainsthorpe, a former workhouse, became visible above the treetops. We passed a sign for the new Donkeybox Café due to open soon at Vale Farm before turning right back onto the lovely tree-lined track we'd started on. This led us back to the church in Mulbarton.

The church had a lovely homely, welcoming feel inside. Beautiful stained glass windows, embroidered kneelers and modern musical instruments showed the mix of old and new. Thanks to Bonnie and her map for leading us on this 4 mile

walk showing us the beauty of the Norfolk farmlands.
