

A year on after a pandemic was declared by the WHO, the world is still reeling under the devastation caused by the covid19 virus. 



New grants available for South Norfolk and Broadland businesses

New business grants from £2,000 to £20,000 are available to support large, small and micro businesses from South Norfolk and Broadland District Councils through the second phase of its discretionary business grant.

The Councils welcome applications from South Norfolk and Broadland businesses of any size, whether home based or based in business premises, business rated or not rated, self-employed or employing staff. They are particularly keen to hear from businesses that have so far been unable to receive any COVID-19 financial support.

To qualify for the Additional Restrictions Grant, businesses must have experienced a loss of income (turnover) of at least 20% or £40,000 and fall into one of the following categories:

- 1. A rated business that did not qualify for Local Restrictions Support Grant payments during national lockdowns or local restrictions
- 2. A business that has so far been unable to receive any COVID-19 financial support including businesses with premises which are not business-rated, or without its own business rating
- 3. A business that employs 10 or more full-time equivalent employees and wishes to request a top-up to a previous Local Restrictions Support Grant award Any business that needs support is encouraged to get in touch to find out what funding they may be eligible for. Please share with your business networks and fellow business owners.

Men on Wacton's Roll of Honour by Robert Maidstone

This month we look at

EDGAR JAMES GOOSE

Private 19427, 2nd Batt. Norfolk Regiment

Edgar was baptised at Forncett St Peter in 1883, the fifth child of James and Mary Goose. By 1891 they had moved to Wreningham where Edgar went to school, then Ashwellthorpe by 1901 when Edgar gave his occupation as 'sheep feeder on a farm'

In 1907 he married Grace Emma Gibbs and appears to be still living at Ashwellthorpe where his first two children were born. The family moved to Wacton in 1909 to the cottages north of Wilderness farm, where Edgar worked as a horseman. They had two further children at Wacton.

In 1914 he enlisted with the 2nd Battalion of the Norfolk Regiment and in August was sent to Bombay and became part of the 6th (Poona) Division of the Indian Army. Then in November the Division was sent to Mesopotamia. They landed near Basra and fought their way north, capturing Kut-al-Amara in 1915, then attacked Ctesiphon in November of that year where they were defeated and retreated to Kut-al-Amara in December 1915. Here they were besieged awaiting re-enforcement from the south.

On the 22nd April Edgar was killed in action, four days before the Division surrendered.

His wife Grace would have been able to register to vote in 1918 but she must have already left Wacton although it appears she remained in the Depwade District for the rest of her life.

Edgar is remembered on the Basra Memorial and at Ashwellthorpe and Wacton.

THOMAS HENRY LAND

Private 30318, Norfolk Regiment

Born in Tacolneston to James and Henrietta Land in 1879, Thomas enlisted in the Norfolk Regiment in 1894 and served for four or five years before, retuning to the Depwade District where he married Ellen Elizabeth Goose in 1899.

They first settled in Ashwellthorpe where in 1901 Thomas was employed as a roadman by the County Council. He registered to vote in Wacton in 1904, having moved from Ashwellthorpe, at Stratton Road. This property has been identified as one of the pair of Cottages now known as Blyth Green Cottage.

In the 1911 Census they had two children Edward Harry and Lena J.

Thomas was recalled to military service at the outbreak of war and joined the London regiment as Private 52056. He remained on the Register of electors for 1914 and 15 but not after that.

The Roll of Honour records him as being in the National Reserve and his last service number 377107 suggests that may be correct.

HENRY FAVILL SCOTT HOLMES

Private, Norfolk Regiment 2nd Lieutenant, 208th Field Company, Royal Engineers

Henry was born in Wacton House on 15th March 1894 where his parents Robert and Ellen lived with grandfather Henry Tuke Holmes. He had two younger sisters.

In 1905 Henry started school at Gresham's near Holt but in 1907 was withdrawn as his father was in financial difficulties, and the family moved to Lowestoft. By 1911 they had moved to Neville Street, Norwich and Henry was employed as a motor engineer.

He enlisted on the 5th August 1914 as a transport driver with the Norfolk Regiment, five months later he was offered a commission and became a 2nd Lieutenant. In March 1915 he transferred to the Royal Engineers and went to France in January 1915.

He was killed in the opening battle of the Somme on 1st of July 1916. He is remembered on Pier 8 face A and D, Thiepval Memorial in France, and at Wacton on the Holmes family monument and War Memorial.





A public consultation has been launched on the Neighbourhood Plan for Long Stratton.

South Norfolk Council is asking residents to comment on the submitted draft Neighbourhood Plan for Long Stratton as part of a consultation, which runs for six weeks, from 22 March to 5.00pm on 6th May.

The consultation is the last opportunity for the public to comment, before the Plan is examined by an independent neighbourhood plan examiner. The examiner's role is to test the Neighbourhood Plan against the basic conditions that are set out in national regulations. If approved by the Council, the Plan will then need to be passed by a referendum of Long Stratton residents, before being adopted as part of the planning framework.

The Neighbourhood plan covers the same area as the Long Stratton Area Action Plan, which was adopted in May 2016 and which also includes parts of Tharston and Hapton parish.

Local District Council member, Alison Thomas said: "It's fantastic that following all the hard work of the Long Stratton community steering group we have now reached the point where we have a fully drafted Neighbourhood Plan and can invite everyone in the community to take a look and share their thoughts on the policies. "I encourage all local residents to take part in the consultation, building on the local engagement that has already happened. It's really important that residents have their say, so that the Neighbourhood Plan, once finalised and adopted, is something everyone in Long Stratton can support."

Kevin Worsley, Chair of Long Stratton Town Council said: I have chaired the Long Stratton Neighbourhood Planning Committee, which is made up of Town Councillors and residents from Stratton, Tharston, and Hapton, for the past 6 years. Our team has given thousands of unpaid hours canvassing local opinions and ensuring that these are reflected in the planning document we have written. This consultation is your last chance to comment on our work before it goes in front of the examiner, who will check it meets all legal requirements. Once this check is complete, there will be a public vote: on behalf of the Long Stratton Neighbourhood Planning Committee, I urge you to vote to ensure that residents' voices are heard at the planning decisions table for many years to come.

Neighbourhood Plans are developed by local communities with support from the district council. They have an equal status to Local Plans in the development plan hierarchy and can set out where, what and how new development should take place in their designated area.
