**James 3.1-12**

***Taming the Tongue***

<sup>3</sup>Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers and sisters, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness. <sup>2</sup>For all of us make many mistakes. Anyone who makes no mistakes in speaking is perfect, able to keep the whole body in check with a bridle. <sup>3</sup>If we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we guide their whole bodies. <sup>4</sup>Or look at ships: though they are so large that it takes strong winds to drive them, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. <sup>5</sup>So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits. How great a forest is set ablaze by a small fire! <sup>6</sup>And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is placed among our members as a world of iniquity; it stains the whole body, sets on fire the cycle of nature, and is itself set on fire by hell. <sup>7</sup>For every species of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, <sup>8</sup>but no one can tame the tongue—a restless evil, full of deadly poison. <sup>9</sup>With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse those who are made in the likeness of God. <sup>10</sup>From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so. <sup>11</sup>Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and brackish water? <sup>12</sup>Can a fig tree, my brothers and sisters, yield olives, or a grapevine figs? No more can salt water yield fresh.

**Mark 8.27-end**

***Peter's Declaration about Jesus***

<sup>27</sup> Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi; and on the way he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that I am?' <sup>28</sup>And they answered him, 'John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets.' <sup>29</sup>He asked them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Peter answered him, 'You are the Messiah.' <sup>30</sup>And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him.

***Jesus Foretells His Death and Resurrection***

<sup>31</sup> Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. <sup>32</sup>He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. <sup>33</sup>But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, 'Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.'

<sup>34</sup> He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. <sup>35</sup>For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. <sup>36</sup>For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? <sup>37</sup>Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? <sup>38</sup>Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.'

## VACANCY - Church Administrator - Part Time Trinity Church Sissinghurst & St Mary's Church Frittenden

We are looking to employ a part time administrator to help in the running of the two churches. Working closely with the Rector, Revd Pete Deaves, the role involves:

- \* Collation and preparation of weekly Orders of Services, co-ordinating printing and distribution.
- \* Planning service rotas for three months ahead.
- \* Collation and preparation of weekly Orders of Services, co-ordinating printing and distribution.
- \* Setting up and operating or linking to Google calendars for booking of events.
- \* Preparation of monthly expense claims.
- \* Administration for weddings, funerals and baptisms.

**Hours & location** - it is envisaged that the role will take approximately twenty hours per month. Some tasks need to be done weekly and others on an occasional or periodic basis so there is need for flexibility over a month. The post holder will be able to work from home. If this is not possible then a room could be made available in the Sissinghurst Parish rooms.

**Essential skills** – we are looking for someone who is personable, unflappable, highly organised, a good communicator and a confident user of Microsoft Word, Excel, Publisher, Adobe Acrobat and email.

Applicants do not need to be a practising Christian to apply, however a knowledge of the Church of England and a motivation to support the growth of the local church will be a distinct advantage.

**Remuneration** – The position will attract a salary of £300 per month.

**Duration** - as this is a new role the initial term is for one year during which time it will be regularly reviewed.
