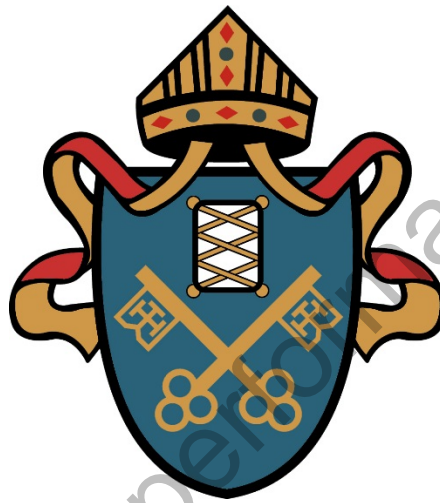

BARNBY, Sir Joseph (1838-1896)

Born in York, where he was a chorister at the Minster; Organist of St. Andrew's Wells Street and St Ann's Soho; Precentor of Eton 1875-1892; Principal of the Royal Academy of Music 1892-1896.

Psalms 10(1), 20, 24, 26

BAYLEY, William (1810-1858)

Born in Tutbury, Staffordshire; Vicar Choral and Master of the Choristers, St Paul's Cathedral 1846-1858.

Psalm 56

BERRY, Alexander (b. 1989)

MA (Cantab), FRCO; chorister at Lichfield Cathedral; Assistant Organist at Magdalen College, Oxford; Organist of Bradford Cathedral since 2017.

Psalm 27

BERTALOT, John (b. 1931)

MA (Cantab), FRCO; born in Maidstone, Kent; Organist of St Matthew's Northampton 1958-1964, Blackburn Cathedral 1964-1983, Trinity Church, Princeton, New Jersey 1983-1998.

Psalm 52(1)

BUCK, Sir Percy Carter (1871-1947)

DMus (Oxon); born in London; Organist of Worcester College Oxford 1891-1894, Wells Cathedral 1896-1899, Bristol Cathedral 1899-1901; Director of Music, Harrow School 1901-1927; Professor of Music, London University 1925-1937.

Psalm 78: 41-56(2)

CAMIDGE, Matthew (1764-1844)

Born in York; Organist of York Minster (as were his father and son) 1799-1842.

Psalm 58

COOKE, Robert (1768-1814)

Born in Westminster; son of the organist and composer Benjamin Cooke; succeeded his father as Organist of St Martin-in-the-Fields 1793; Organist of Westminster Abbey 1802-1814. He met his death by drowning in the Thames.

Psalm 79

CROTCH, William (1775-1847)

DMus (Oxon); born in Norwich; child prodigy; played the organ before the King when he was three and a half; Organist of Christ Church Cathedral Oxford 1790-1807; Professor of Music, Oxford University 1797-1847; first Principal of the Royal Academy of Music 1822-1832.

Psalm 73(1)

DAVIES, Sir Henry Walford, KCVO, OBE (1869-1941)

MusD (Cantab), HonDMus (Oxon), HonMusD (Dublin), HonFRCO; born in Oswestry, Shropshire; Organist of the Temple Church 1898-1923, St George's Chapel Windsor 1927-1932; Professor of music at University College, Aberystwyth 1919-1926; Master of the King's Music 1934-1941.

Psalms 14, 23

DAVY, John (1763-1824)

Composer of many works for the stage, mostly produced at Covent Garden between 1800 and 1821. He is best known for his song, *The Bay of Biscay*.

Psalm 50(1)

EDWARDS, Edwin (1830-1907)

FRCO; born in Street, Somerset; Director of Music and Organist of Rugby School 1867-1886.

Psalm 15

ELGAR, Sir Edward William, Bart., OM, GCVO (1857-1934)

HonMusD (Cantab), HonDMus (Oxon), (Dunelm), (Yale); born in Lower Broadheath, Worcestershire; Professor of Music, Birmingham University 1905-1908; Master of the King's Music 1924-1934.

Psalm 68(1)

FLINTOFT, The Revd. Luke (c1680-1727)

Priest Vicar of Lincoln Cathedral 1704-1714; Gentleman of the Chapel Royal 1715; Reader in the Whitehall Chapel and Minor Canon of Westminster Abbey 1719-27. It is possible that he was only the arranger of this chant, which has its origins in Allison's Psalter (1599) and John Playford's *Whole Booke of Psalms* (1677) where it appears under the name *Salisbury*. Along with Morley in D minor, this is the earliest known example of a double chant.

Psalm 7

GARRETT, George Mursell (1834-1897)

MusD, MA (Cantab); born in Winchester, son of a lay clerk at the Cathedral; chorister at New College Oxford; pupil of and assistant to S S Wesley at Winchester; Organist of Madras Cathedral 1854-1856, St. John's College Cambridge 1856-1897.

Psalm 8

GOSS, Sir John (1800-1880)

HonMusD (Cantab), FRCO; born in Fareham, Hampshire, where his father was organist of the Parish Church; pupil

of Thomas Attwood, whom he succeeded as Organist of St Paul's Cathedral 1838-72.

Psalms 3, 21, 48, 53

HERVEY, The Revd. Frederick Alfred John, CVO (1846-1910)

MA (Cantab); born in Westminster; Rector of Sandringham 1878-1907; Canon of Norwich Cathedral 1907-1910. Domestic Chaplain to King Edward VII.

Psalm 38

HOPKINS, Edward John (1818-1901)

DMus (Cantuar), FRCO; born in Westminster where he was a chorister at the Abbey; sang at the coronation of King William IV; Organist of the Temple Church 1843-1898.

Psalm 52(2)

IVES, Grayston (b. 1948)

DMus (Cantuar), FRSCM; chorister at Ely Cathedral; member of the King's Singers 1978-1985; Organist and Informator Choristarum of Magdalen College Oxford 1991-2009.

Psalm 10(2)

KNIGHT, Gerald Hocken, CBE (1908-1979)

DMus (Cantuar), MA, MusB (Cantab), FRCO; born in Par, Cornwall; Organist of Canterbury Cathedral 1937-1952; Director of the Royal School of Church Music 1952-1972.

Psalm 45

MACPHERSON, Charles (1870-1927)

HonDMus (Dunelm); born in Edinburgh; chorister at St Paul's Cathedral where he was later Sub-Organist 1895-1916, Organist 1916-1927.

Psalm 78: 41-56(1)

MANN, Arthur Henry (1850-1929)

DMus (Oxon), HonMA (Cantab), FRCO; Born in Norwich, where he was a chorister at the Cathedral and articed pupil of Zechariah Buck; organist of Beverley Minster 1875-1876, King's College Cambridge 1876-1929. "Daddy" Mann introduced Choral Scholars to the choir at King's and in 1918 directed the first Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols to be held there.

Psalm 78: 1-17

MARTIN, Sir George Clement, MVO (1844-1916)

DMus (Cantuar), BMus (Oxon), HonDMus (Oxon), FRCO; born in Lambourn, Berkshire; pupil of Sir John Stainer; Sub-Organist of St Paul's Cathedral 1876-1888, Organist 1888-1916.

Psalm 32

OUSELEY, The Revd. Sir Frederick Arthur Gore, Bart. (1825-1889)

MA, DMus (Oxon), HonDMus (Dunelm), HonMusD (Dublin); born in London; child prodigy; Precentor of Hereford Cathedral 1855-1889; Professor of Music, Oxford University 1855-1889; founder (1856) and first Warden of St Michael's College Tenbury.

Psalm 71(2)

PARRATT, Sir Walter, KCVO (1841-1924)

HonMA, HonDMus (Oxon), HonMusD (Cantab), HonDMus (Dunelm); born in Huddersfield; Organist and Informator Choristarum of Magdalen College Oxford 1872-1882; Organist of St George's Chapel Windsor 1882-1924; Professor of Music, Oxford University 1908-1918; Master of the Queen's (later King's) Musick 1893-1924.

Psalms 36(1&2), 40(1), 59(2), 62

RHODES, Keith Vernon (1930-1992)

ARSCM; born in Bradford; Organist of Bradford Cathedral 1963-1981.

Psalm 54

ROBERTS, John Varley (1841-1920)

DMus, HonMA (Oxon); born in Stanningley, Leeds; Organist of St Bartholomew's Armley 1862-1868, Halifax Parish Church (now Minster) 1868-1882, Organist and Informator Choristarum of Magdalen College Oxford 1882-1918.

Psalm 18(3)

ROBINSON, John (1682-1762)

Organist of Westminster Abbey 1727-1762. According to William Boyce "a most excellent performer on the organ."

Psalm 34

ROSE, Bernard William George, OBE (1916-1996)

MusB, MA (Cantab), MA, DMus (Oxon); born in Little Hallingbury, Hertfordshire; chorister at Salisbury Cathedral; Organist of The Queen's College Oxford 1939-1957, Organist and Informator Choristarum of Magdalen College Oxford 1957-1981.

Psalms 70, 75

SMITH, Walter Ernest (1879-c1962)

BMus (Oxon); chorister at Wells and Bristol Cathedrals; Co-Director of Music, Clifton College 1902-1955.

Psalm 18(2)

STAINER, Sir John (1840-1901)

MA, DMus (Oxon), HonDMus (Dunelm), FRCO; born in Southwark, London; chorister at St Paul's Cathedral; Organist of St Michael's College Tenbury 1857-1860,

Magdalen College Oxford 1860-1872, St Paul's Cathedral 1872-1888; Professor of Music, Oxford University 1889-1899.

Psalm 73(2)

STEWART, Haldane Campbell (1868-1942)

MA, DMus (Oxon); born in Notting Hill, London; batsman for Kent County Cricket Club 1892-1903; Director of Music, Tonbridge School 1898-1919; Organist and Informator Choristarum of Magdalen College Oxford 1919-1938; Acting Organist 1941-1942 during the absence of William McKie on active service; father of Top of the Pops founder producer Lorn Alastair ("Johnnie") Stewart.

Psalms 4, 50(2), 68(2), 76

TALBOT, The Revd. George Surtees (1875-1918)

MA (Oxon); Vicar Choral (Minor Canon) of York Minster 1903-1918; Vicar of Huntington, York 1915-1918. The last words of Sir Edward Bairstow's unfinished autobiography, describing Talbot's funeral, are "*I have missed Talbot ever since.*"

Psalm 40(2)

TAYLOR, Philip John (1892-c1970)

Born in Fletton, Huntingdonshire; Organist and Informator Choristarum of Magdalen College Oxford 1943-1957. Very little biographical detail appears to exist on him.

Psalms 65, 68(3)

TURLE, James (1802-1882)

Born in Taunton, Somerset; chorister at Wells Cathedral; Organist of Westminster Abbey 1831-1882.

Psalm 30(1&2), 59(1)

WALMISLEY, Thomas Attwood (1814-1856)

MA, MusD (Cantab); born in London; son of the composer of glees Thomas Forbes Walmisley; Organist of Trinity and St John's Colleges Cambridge 1833-56; Acting Organist of King's College and Great St Mary's Church Cambridge c1850-1855; Professor of Music, Cambridge University 1836-1856.

Psalm 18(1)

WESLEY, Samuel (1766-1837)

Born in Bristol; son of Charles Wesley the hymn writer; nephew of John Wesley, founder of Methodism; father of S S Wesley. A prolific composer in all areas of music and an enthusiastic promoter of the music of Bach.
