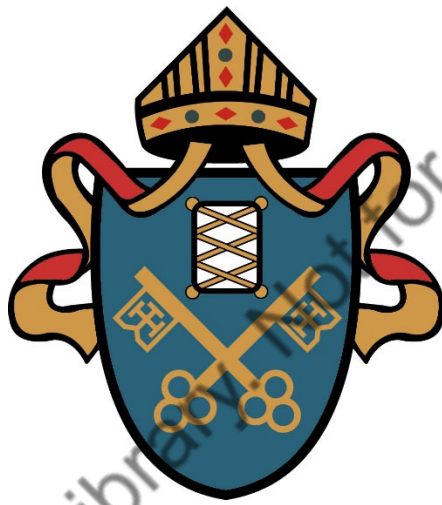

**ASHFIELD, Robert James (1911-2006)**

DMus (London), FRCO; born in Chipstead, Surrey; Organist of Southwell Minster 1946-1956, Rochester Cathedral 1956-1977.

Psalm 135

**ATKINS, Sir Ivor Algernon (1869-1953)**

DMus (Oxon), MusD (Cantab), FRCO; born in Llandaff, Cardiff; Organist of Ludlow Collegiate Church 1893-1897, Worcester Cathedral 1897-1950. Friend and supporter of Elgar.

Psalm 118 (2)

**BARBER, Geoffrey Hopwood (1913-1974)**

Born in Stockport; Organist of St Paul's Heaton Moor 1949-1967; Royal School of Church Music Northern Commissioner 1967-1974.

Psalm 109 (1)

**BERRY, Alexander (b. 1989)**

MA (Cantab), FRCO; chorister at Lichfield Cathedral; Assistant Organist at Magdalen College, Oxford; Organist of Bradford Cathedral since 2017.

Psalms 107 (2), 119: 25-32, 134

**CHERUBINI, Maria Luigi Carlo Zenobio Salvatore (1760-1842)**

Composer and theorist. Chant adapted by F Deffel (identity unknown) from the Requiem Mass of 1817.

Psalm 81 (2)

**COOKE, Benjamin (1734-1793)**

HonDMus (Oxon), MusD (Cantab); born in Covent Garden, London; Assistant Organist of Westminster Abbey at age 12, Organist 1762-1793. Succeeded by his son Robert Cooke (see Month 1).

Psalm 86 (1)

**COOPER, David Anthony (1949-2008)**

MA (Oxon), FRCO; born in Derby; Assistant Organist of Wells Cathedral 1977-1983; Organist of Blackburn Cathedral 1983-1994, Norwich Cathedral 1994-1995.

Psalm 89: 37-51 (1)

**DAVIES, Sir Henry Walford, KCVO, OBE (1869-1941)**

MusD (Cantab), HonDMus (Oxon), HonMusD (Dublin), HonFRCO; born in Oswestry, Shropshire; Organist of the Temple Church 1898-1923, St George's Chapel Windsor

1927-1932; Professor of music at University College, Aberystwyth 1919-1926; Master of the King's Music 1934-1941.

Psalms 103 (1&2), 121

**EDWARDS, Paul Christison (b. 1955)**

ARCO; born in Bedford; chorister at St Paul's Cathedral; Lay Clerk (alto), Peterborough Cathedral 1978-1982; organist of various churches in the Bedford area. Prolific composer of church music, including the carol *No Small Wonder*.

Psalm 86 (2)

**ELGAR, Sir Edward William, Bart., OM, GCVO (1857-1934)**

HonMusD (Cantab), HonDMus (Oxon), (Dunelm), (Yale); born in Lower Broadheath, Worcestershire; Professor of Music, Birmingham University 1905-1908; Master of the King's Music 1924-1934.

Psalms 107 (3), 138

**GAUNTLETT, Henry John (1805-1876)**

DMus (Cantuar); born in Wellington, Shropshire; qualified as a solicitor and pursued a legal career until 1846; thereafter organist of several London churches. Played the organ at the first performance of Mendelssohn's *Elijah*. Composed over 1,000 hymn tunes, the most famous of which is *Irby* ("Once in royal David's city").

Psalm 112

**GOSS, Sir John (1800-1880)**

HonMusD (Cantab), FRCO; born in Fareham, Hampshire, where his father was organist of the Parish Church; pupil of Thomas Attwood, whom he succeeded as Organist of St Paul's Cathedral 1838-72. Chant 105(2) arranged from the hymn tune by Jeremiah Clarke King's Norton.

Psalms 105 (3), 115

**GROOME, The Revd Robert Hindes (1810-1889)**

MA (Cantab); born in Framlingham, Suffolk; Rector of Monk Soham, Suffolk.

Psalm 119: 65-72

**HANFORTH, Thomas William (1867-1948)**

BMus (Dunelm), FRCO; born in Hunslet, Leeds; chorister at Leeds Parish Church (now Minster); Deputy Organist of York Minster 1887-1892; Organist of Sheffield Parish Church (later Cathedral) 1892-1937.

Psalm 81 (1)

**HOPKINS, Edward John (1818-1901)**

DMus (Cantuar), FRCO; born in Westminster where he was a chorister at the Abbey; sang at the coronation of King William IV; Organist of the Temple Church 1843-1898.

**Psalms 140 (1&2), 145**

**HOW, Martin John Richard, MBE (b. 1931)**

MA (Cantab), FRCO; born in Liverpool where his father was rector of St Nicholas' Church (and later Bishop of Glasgow & Galloway); Organist of Grimsby Parish Church 1961-1964; Royal School of Church Music Southern Commissioner 1955-1991.

**Psalm 127**

**HOWELLS, Herbert Norman, CH, CBE (1892-1983)**

DMus (Oxon), HonMusD (Cantab), HonDMus (RCM); born in Lydney, Gloucestershire; Director of Music, St Paul's Girls' School 1936-1945; Acting Organist of St John's College Cambridge 1939-1945; King Edward Professor of Music, London University.

**Psalms 120, 125**

**HUNTLEY, George Frederick (1859-1913)**

MusD (Cantab); born in Datchet, Berkshire; Organist of Newcastle Cathedral 1894-1895, St Peter's Eaton Square 1895-1913; Professor of Music at the Royal Academy of Music.

**Psalm 82**

**IVES, Grayston (b. 1948)**

DMus (Cantuar), FRSCM; chorister at Ely Cathedral; member of the King's Singers 1978-1985; Organist and Informator Choristarum of Magdalen College Oxford 1991-2009.

**Psalms 91, 119: 105-112, 119: 113-120**

**JACKSON, Francis Alan, CBE (b. 1917)**

DMus (Dunelm), DMus (Cantuar), FRCO; born in Malton, Yorkshire; chorister at York Minster under Sir Edward Bairstow, whom he succeeded as Organist 1946-1982.

**Psalm 147**

**LANG, Craig Sellar (1891-1971)**

DMus (Dunelm); born in Hastings, New Zealand; Music Master at the Royal Naval College at Osborne 1913-1920, Clifton College 1920-1929; Director of Music, Christ's Hospital 1929-1945.

**Psalm 137**

**LEY, Henry George (1887-1962)**

MA, DMus (Oxon), HonFRCO; born in Chagford, Devon, where his father was rector; chorister at St George's Chapel Windsor, where he was accompanying services on

the organ at age 12; Organist of Christ Church Cathedral Oxford 1909-1926; Precentor of Eton 1926-1945.

**Psalm 119: 153-160**

**LLOYD, Charles Harford (1849-1919)**

MA, DMus (Oxon), FRCO; born in Thornbury, Gloucestershire; Organist of Gloucester Cathedral 1876-1882, Christ Church Cathedral Oxford 1872-1892; Precentor of Eton 1892-1917; Organist of the Chapel Royal 1917-1919.

**Psalm 93**

**LUTHER, Martin (1483-1546)**

Born in Eisleben, Holy Roman Empire; professor, theologian, composer, priest and monk; seminal figure in the German Reformation. Chant adapted by John Goss from the chorale *Ein feste Burg*.

**Psalm 105 (1)**

**MARSHALL, Joseph Philip (1921-2005)**

DMus (Dunelm), FRCO; born in Brighouse; Organist of St Botolph's Boston 1951-1957, Ripon Cathedral 1957-1966, Lincoln Cathedral 1966-1986.

**Psalms 101, 150 (alternative 1)**

**MIDDLETON, James Roland (1896-1983)**

DMus (Dunelm), FRCO; born in Ringwood, Hampshire; Organist of Mold Parish Church 1923-44; Assistant Organist of Chester Cathedral 1934-44; Organist of Chelmsford Cathedral 1944-1949, Chester Cathedral 1949-1963, St Asaph Cathedral 1963-70.

**Psalm 97**

**NAYLOR, Charles Legh (1869-1945)**

Born in Scarborough, son of John Naylor (later Organist of York Minster); Assistant Organist of York Minster from 1891; Organist St Peter's Harrogate 1892-1902 and 1917-1935. Brother of E W Naylor, composer of *Vox Dicentis: Clama*.

**Psalms 100, 119: 73-80**

**PARRY, Sir Charles Hubert Hastings, Bart. (1848-1918)**

HonDMus (Oxon), HonMusD (Cantab), HonMusD (Dublin), BMus (Oxon); born in Bournemouth; Professor of Music, Oxford University 1900-08; Director of the Royal College of Music 1894-1918. He took his Oxford BMus while still a boy at Eton.

**Psalm 84**

**ROBERTS, John Varley (1841-1920)**

DMus, HonMA (Oxon); born in Stanningley, Leeds; Organist of St Bartholomew's Armley 1862-1868, Halifax Parish Church (now Minster) 1868-1882, Organist and Informator Choristarum of Magdalen College Oxford 1882-1918.

Psalm 131

**ROSE, Bernard William George, OBE (1916-1996)**

MusB, MA (Cantab), MA, DMus (Oxon); born in Little Hallingbury, Hertfordshire; chorister at Salisbury Cathedral; Organist of The Queen's College Oxford 1939-1957, Organist and Informator Choristarum of Magdalen College Oxford 1957-1981.

Psalms 105 (2), 143

**SMART, Henry Thomas (1813-1879)**

Born in London; nephew of the conductor and hymn tune composer Sir George Smart; Organist of Blackburn Parish Church (now Cathedral) 1831-1836, followed by various London churches including St Pancras 1864-1879. Almost totally blind for the last 15 years of his life.

Psalm 89: 1-19

**STAINER, Sir John (1840-1901)**

MA, DMus (Oxon), HonDMus (Dunelm), FRCO; born in Southwark, London; chorister at St Paul's Cathedral; Organist of St Michael's College Tenbury 1857-1860, Magdalen College Oxford 1860-1872, St Paul's Cathedral 1872-1888; Professor of Music, Oxford University 1889-1899.

Psalm 87

**STANFORD, Sir Charles Villiers (1852-1924)**

MA, MusD (Cantab), HonDMus (Oxon); born in Dublin; Organist of Trinity College Cambridge 1874-1892; Professor of Music, Cambridge University 1887-1924; Professor of Composition, Royal College of Music 1883-1923.

Psalms 126, 149, 150 (alternative 2)

**STEWART, Arthur Charles Lestoc Hylton (1884-1932)**

MA (Cantab); born in Chester, where his father was Precentor of the Cathedral; Organist of Blackburn Parish

Church (now Cathedral) 1914-1916; Rochester Cathedral 1916-1930; Chester Cathedral 1930-1932; St George's Chapel Windsor for a few weeks until his death from meningitis.

Psalm 109 (2)

**STEWART, Haldane Campbell (1868-1942)**

MA, DMus (Oxon); born in Notting Hill, London; batsman for Kent County Cricket Club 1892-1903; Director of Music, Tonbridge School 1898-1919; Organist and Informator Choristarum of Magdalen College Oxford 1919-1938; Acting Organist 1941-1942 during the absence of William McKie on active service; father of Top of the Pops founder producer Lorn Alastair ("Johnnie") Stewart.

Psalm 107 (1), 118 (1)

**TALBOT, The Revd. George Surtees (1875-1918)**

MA (Oxon); Vicar Choral (Minor Canon) of York Minster 1903-1918; Vicar of Huntington, York 1915-1918. The last words of Sir Edward Bairstow's unfinished autobiography, describing Talbot's funeral, are "I have missed Talbot ever since."

Psalms 94, 150

**TURLE, James (1802-1882)**

Born in Taunton, Somerset; chorister at Wells Cathedral; Organist of Westminster Abbey 1831-1882. Chant adapted from Henry Purcell's anthem *My Beloved Spake*.

Psalm 130

**VANN, William Stanley (1910-2010)**

DMus (Cantuar), BMus (London), FRCO; born in Leicester; Organist of Gainsborough Parish Church 1933-1939, Holy Trinity Leamington Spa 1939-1949, Chelmsford Cathedral 1949-1953, Peterborough Cathedral 1953-1977.

Psalm 119: 145-152

**WEST, John Ebenezer William (1863-1929)**

Born in South Hackney, London; organist of various London churches; musical editor and adviser to Novello & Co. Died while conducting a concert of the Railway Clearing House Male Voice Choir.
