





Q1 Age of those completing the questions




Q2 Which Service do you normally attend?

■ I don't feel engaged


■ I feel I'm sometimes watching from the side-lines.

■ Yes. I feel engaged in the church.


■ Yes. I feel very engaged in the church, its mission, and initiatives.

Q11 Do you feel comfortable returning?




Q6 Christian Growth?

- I prefer no music




Q6. Which age group prefer traditional hymns?




