- Personally, take some time through the week to quietly reflect and go through the questions on your own and apply the message to your life.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What struck you, challenged you or inspired you about the story of the author of the hymn: It is well, Horatio Spafford?
- 2. Why do you think Satan often attacks a Christian at the point of his or her assurance of salvation?
- 3. Read Romans 5:1. How do you understand the concept that before we were converted, we were at war with God?
- 4. Read Romans 1:18, Ephesians 5:6, Revelation 19:15, Psalm 7:11. God is at war with unbelievers. How does the wrath of God work? Is it unfair that God should act like this towards unbelievers?
- 5. Read Colossians 1:20-22. Discuss the transforming work of Christ and what he does? You might want to share briefly how you personally made peace with God through Christs saving work in your life.
- 6. Read Hebrews 8:12. How does this make you feel and why is this possible?
- 7. Read Romans 5:2. Grace means that God gives us what we don't deserve. How does that help you when you sin? How does Grace also give you the assurance of your faith in Christ.
- 8. Read Hebrews 4:18, Hebrews 10:19-22. How is it possible that we can have full access to God? In light of this, how does that help you in praying to God?
