'Joseph's master took him and put him in prison, the place where the king's prisoners were confined. But while Joseph was there in the prison, the Lord was with him; he showed him kindness and granted him favour in the eyes of the prison warder.' Genesis 39:20-21 NIV

'The captain of the guard assigned them to Joseph, and he attended them. After they had been in custody for some time...' Genesis 40:4-5 NIV

""Why are your faces so sad today?" "We both had dreams," they answered, "but there is noone to interpret them." Then Joseph said to them, "Do not interpretations belong to God? Tell me your dreams." Genesis 40:7-9 NIV
