12.30pm Open ringing (not muffled) to mark 100 years since the signing of the Armistice. This to coincide with ringing at towers across the country and the Cenotaph march-past.

12.30pm Dronfield Handbell Ringers ringing in The Barn courtyard, as their contribution to the occasion.

7.03pm. St Johns Church Bells will ring out and the Handbell Ringers will be ringing in Sindelfingen Park as the Beacon is lit to commemorate 100years since the end of the First World War.

Light a Candle for Peace

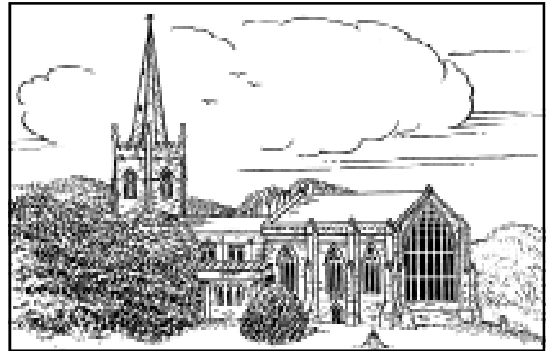
As part of our Remembrance weekend the church will be open so that people can light a candle for peace:
