**Our architect, Carl Andrews, will be present with Peter and members of the DCC to answer questions .**

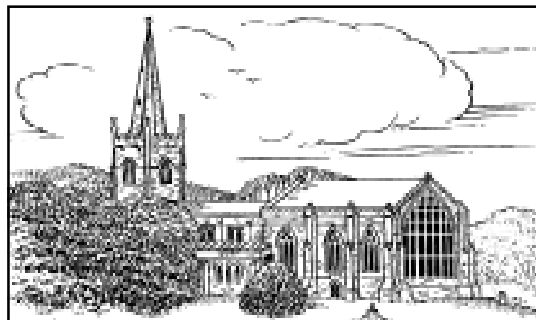
