yet the Lord shall be their refuge.

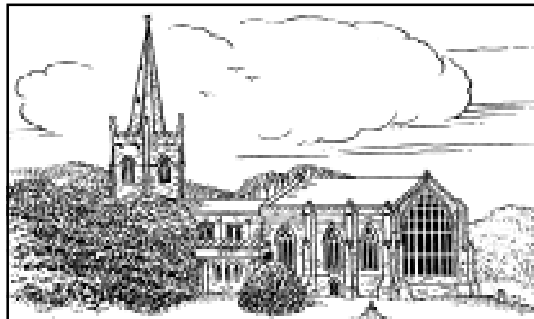
7 O that Israel's salvation would come out of Zion!
