10 The Lord shall reign for ever, your God, O Zion, throughout all generations. Alleluia.

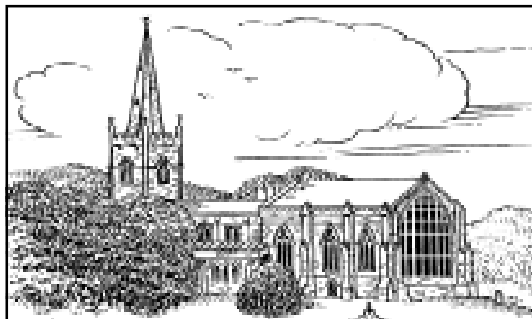
Thursday 10 Oct 10am -3pm St Thomas, Brampton, Chesterfield
