5 My footsteps hold fast in the ways of your commandments; my feet have not stumbled in your paths.

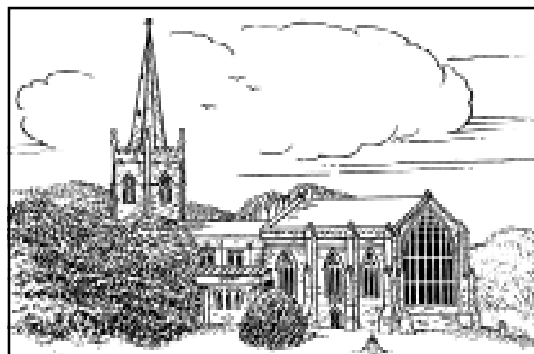
6 I call upon you, O God, for you will answer me; incline your ear to me, and listen to my words.
