Please pray for the situation in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Tearfund have written to us with news of the situation. Please also give if you are able:

Dear Friends,

The Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) is in crisis. Vulnerable people like \*Dheve and her family urgently need your church's help.

The DRC is a country that has been ravaged by decades of conflict. Over the last 12 months, the violence has intensified significantly.

The threat of diseases such as Ebola and Covid-19 hang over the population. And on top of that, natural disasters like floods and the recent volcanic eruption have created a wave of devastation across the east of the country. Tearfund has launched an emergency appeal, and your church's support could make a powerful difference.

The DRC faces not one crisis, but many. More than 5 million people have been forced from their homes — including 3 million children. Communities, homes and livelihoods have been abandoned. Families like Dheve's live in temporary camps, lacking access to many of the basics needed to survive.

'I still remember the night the rebels came to my house,' Dheve shares. 'They took my uncle and killed him. They killed my sister-in-law who was pregnant.

'Before we came here we ate well. But when we arrived here we had no houses to live in. I now live in this small tarpaulin house with my children and my brother.'

Tearfund can offer effective help to people in urgent need. In the short term, we're providing clean drinking water, handwashing stations, toilets and hygiene kits — all vital in stopping the spread of diseases such as Covid-19.

We're also giving families farming tools, seeds and training to help them get back on their feet and provide for themselves in the future. But the need is great. We can't reach those like Dheve and her family without support from churches like yours.

Your church can make a difference today for people like Dheve. Despite all she has been through, she has not given up hope: 'I believe in God and in his mercy. I believe in his power and I always pray to God to give peace to the Congolese people and my province, because we have lived through a lot of war.'
