


Unfortunately the Circuit Missions Event at Greens Lane on Saturday 30th September has been cancelled

Historic England Grants

Historic England have announced the second round of funding for <u>Everyday Heritage Grants</u>: <u>Celebrating Working Class Histories</u>. These grants will fund community-led and people-focused projects to tell the stories of people and places missing from the records of history.

Historic England is trying to reach community and heritage organisations, inviting them to apply for grants of up to £25,000. They are also interested in funding smaller grassroots projects starting at £1,000, in the hope of reaching people who haven't worked with Historic England before.

Each project should enable people to share untold stories about the places where they live, encouraging communities to examine and tell stories in their own way. The projects selected will contribute positively to participants' wellbeing and sense of pride in their place, as well as provide innovative volunteering opportunities.

Volunteer Role Outline	
Background information	A time limited (18 months) strategic volunteer post to support the North East Chinese Methodist Mission Partnership (NECMMP) in its business planning and grant applications aimed at providing stability for the next 5 years during a period of rapid growth and transition.
Volunteer Role Title:	Development Officer
Location:	North East Chinese Methodist Mission Partnership (Darlington and Newcastle Districts)
Responsible to:	Volunteer will be under the supervision of Revd Richard Andrew, Chair of the Darlington District and the NECMMP Resources Group.
Hours per week:	As and when available. No more than 5 hours per week.

Key volunteer activities

- Engaging with the Resources Group to establish ministry needs and objectives for the next 5 years.
- Develop a business plan identifying key priorities and an outline budget for the next 5 years.
- Support the Chinese Methodist churches in developing a giving and volunteer strategy.
- Working closely to identify potential funders and grant providers and take a lead in applying for funding.

We are looking for people who have the following skills and attributes:

- Skills and experience in business and strategic planning.
- Well organised and self-motivated, able to manage the workload efficiently.
- Ability to engage and collaborate closely with colleagues and to establish positive and productive relationships.
- Ability to recognise and develop the gifts of others and foster an environment of participation.
- Willingness to undertake safeguarding training as appropriate.
- Ability to self motivate and work in a team.
- Desirable a car driver willing to travel to engage with the 3 congregations in Durham, Middlesbrough and Durham.

Criminal record check

The volunteer will need a satisfactory criminal record clearance certificate. Volunteers will be asked to provide all relevant documents for these checks. If a new DBS is required the cost of the check will be met by the NECMMP.

Level of commitment:

The volunteer has full rights to decide their own working hours but it is likely that more hours will be required in the early stages of the project.

Training and support provided:

- Volunteers are required to provide the District with Safeguarding Training dates.
- Volunteers are required to complete EDI and Unconscious Bias training.
- Volunteers will receive out of pocket expenses mileage at 45p per mile and hospitality when needed.

Supervisor:

Volunteers will be supervised by the Chair of the Darlington District and the NECMMP Resources Group.
