Rediscovering our Mission



The Five Marks of Mission of the Anglican Communion

- 1. Proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom (TELL)
- 2. Teach, Baptise and Nurture New Disciples (TEACH)
- 3. Respond to human need with acts of loving service (TEND)
- 4. Seek to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind, and to pursue peace and reconciliation (TRANSFORM)
- 5. Strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth (TREASURE)





First Mark of Mission:

Proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom

The Reconciliation of All Things

Colossians 1:15-20

¹⁵ The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. ¹⁶ For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him.
¹⁷ He is before all things, and in him all things hold together.

¹⁸ And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in all things he might have the supremacy. ¹⁹ For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, ²⁰ and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.
















