Reading: Mark 4 verses 26-34

He also said, "This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man scatters seed on the ground. Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how. All by itself the soil produces grain—first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head. As soon as the grain is ripe, he puts the sickle to it, because the harvest has come."

Again he said, "What shall we say the kingdom of God is like, or what parable shall we use to describe it? It is like a mustard seed, which is the smallest of all seeds on earth. Yet when planted, it grows and becomes the largest of all garden plants, with such big branches that the birds can perch in its shade."

With many similar parables Jesus spoke the word to them, as much as they could understand. He did not say anything to them without using a parable but when he was alone with his own disciples, he explained everything.

Talk:

I was very excited when I saw the theme of this week's service. "The growing adventure".

I have always been amazed by nature. How do such beautiful. colourful and different flowers grow from little brown bulbs or from tiny brown seeds? Why are trees so wonderful and tall and each year have fresh leaves which last for the summer and then turn golden and brown and fall. I look at the wonder of nature in total amazement.

I then began to compare it to my own growth and adventure in faith and reading the words in Mark 4 verses 26 - 34 brought home to me how my own faith grew - just like a mustard seed.

When I was young and before I found my faith. I could never understand what life was about. Why are we here? What was the purpose of life? Why are our wonderfully creative complex bodies born and then wither away and die?

It was only after I lost my mother at the age of 15 when I began to search for and recognise God that I realised why I was here and what life was about - faith answered my question - what is the meaning and purpose of life.

My faith did not happen in a flash, it started by me opening my eyes, looking, listening, and seeking God and it grew until it was an intrinsic part of my life. Just like the mustard seed and the trees of Lebanon, my faith grew stronger and more visible in every aspect of my life.

But the slow growth of faith could not happen until I opened my heart and mind to God and then all the pieces of life's jigsaw fell into place.

Throughout that growth there have been wonderful instances of God's love and support and I regularly see miracles occurring as He leads me through my life of faith with love and patience, guiding me through decisions and forgiving me for my regular failings. Faith is a wonderful gift!

Every day I meet people who are searching and who feel lost - the answer is so close if only they open their lives to Father God and Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour who are here for

each and every one of us - whatever age we are - we can all open our hearts and minds to His love and the peace that knowing God brings.

Grasp life today with all its complexity and let God in and know His peace, His love and assurance for the future
