




Except for your personal prayers and reflections, everything that you need for this Litany will appear on your screen.

Let us keep a moment of silence as we prepare ourselves for prayer, and then I will read some verses from Paul's letter to the Ephesians, chapter 3.


## Silence




## Ephesians, chapter 3, verses 14-17


There are three days this month when we are asked for specific prayers:

July 17 - World Day for International Justice


July 30 - World Day Against People Trafficking

So, in our prayers today, let us be especially mindful of these areas as we continue to pray for a more inclusive society and a more inclusive church.




Lord God, you have promised to hear us as we pray in faith.

Grant us the strength of heart and mind to look beyond ourselves and to address the needs of others here and throughout the world and to care for your creation.




We pray for those experiencing homelessness and those who come alongside them; for an end to the growing disparity between the rich and the poor, and for the grace and courage to strive for economic justice.

God of all gifts and blessings,





God of children, young people and families,





God of nature and the universe,





God of absolution and mercy,





God of fellowship and equality,




We pray for all immigrants, refugees, and pilgrims from around the world, that they may be welcomed in our midst and be treated with fairness, dignity, and respect.

God of outcasts and wanderers,




We pray for the reconciliation of all people, and for the Church throughout the world, that she may be an instrument of your healing love.



**Amen** 




May the God who created a world of diversity and vibrancy,
