## One in 10 UK families will struggle to cover basics this winter, charity finds Citizens Advice calls for government action to help the 3m households hit by a cost of living crunch

One in 10 UK families – about 3m households – are facing a cost of living crunch this winter, unable to cover even basic bills such as food and heating, according to Citizens Advice.

One in five of all adults had cut back on their food shop or turned off the heating, while one in 10 anticipated having to use food banks, a survey by the consumer charity found.

Citizens Advice urged the government to bring forward its standard inflation-matching uprating of benefits from April to December, arguing this could make the average family on universal credit £30 a month better off.....

# 'The Shed' to the rescue !

The main hall at the Friends Meeting House was closed at half term. Some important maintenance work was necessary so B30FB had to operate from a smaller room at the back of the building. Not a problem - except there is a step going in to the building at the side - not good when we needed to use a trolley to transfer nearly two tonnes of food and toiletries in and out that week!

Moseley and Kings Heath Shed came to the rescue. They are based in Kings Heath Park and their underlying principle is to provide somewhere for older people, to meet, have a chat, enjoy a hot drink, share skills and knowledge, and make, re-purpose or mend things. When Larry from the Shed heard about this, he said that they would sort it. After measuring up, making a few diagrams and using his wealth of knowledge, we were presented with a portable, weatherproofed ramp so that we could continue to transfer all the food by trolley.

“It is the difference between being able to buy my children suitable winter clothing, or not. This £20 per week means that although things are financially tight, we are able to muddle through to the best of my ability, and I have peace of mind that all bills are paid and my children are fed, clean and warm. Losing the £20 a week means that on top of coping with the grief of losing my husband, trying to look after a toddler and a new born, keeping a clean and tidy house, I am now also trying to keep my sanity intact as I worry hugely about our financial situation.”

What happens when you can't afford the basics? Thousands of people across the UK are being forced into impossible decisions every day because of poverty. Could you imagine having to make decisions like these?


# Your donations are vital

### Urgent needs

#### **Christmas Donations Urgently Needed before 8th December please!**

Tinned ham, tinned salmon, tinned peas, tinned carrots, tinned potatoes, ready made tinned or packet custard for Christmas food parcels

**Christmas items NOT needed as we are well stocked** mince pies, Christmas Puddings, chocolate and selection boxes

### Also urgently needed

Sugar 500g (not larger), potato smash, jam/honey, porridge, UHT whole milk, long-life fruit juice, tinned tomatoes, liquid or bar soap, gender neutral roll-on/stick deodorant gender neutral shampoo, disposable razors, strong carrier bags, toilet rolls, washing up liquid (not bigger than 500ml), single or duo wrapped toothbrushes

### Low in stock

cereal (not greater than 500g, UHT semi-skinned milk, tinned rice pudding, noodles pack/pot, teabags (40's or 80's, instant coffee (not decaffeinated), rice, tinned potatoes, crisps, ready-made custard (tinned or carton - not powder) laundry power/liquid (not family sized), squash, baby wipes, chocolate and snack bars, tinned/packet vegetarian meal
