Ash – Miss Peck and Mrs Hollins:

This week we started to learn all about Australia and the different landmarks that you may see there. The children chose their favourite landmark and wrote a sentence about it in their books describing what it looks like. On Tuesday we had our sports day and the children all had lots of fun and were very excited about it. We were so impressed with the children's determination and eagerness to take part in all of the different activities and races- well done Ash class! On Wednesday the children wrote about their favourite part of sports day; the sack race and obstacle course were the most popular events! In Maths this week we have been learning about Shape and have been finding the area and perimeter of rectangular shapes. We have also learnt how to plot co-ordinates. In Science we have been investigating what plants need to grow and have planned an investigation, which we will be completing over the next few weeks. We have continued our Mexican Yarn pictures and have of course taken part in both Sports day and Sports day practices.
