### Mathematics

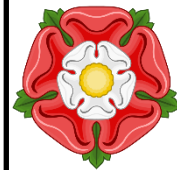
#### Year 4

- **Number and place value:** partitioning, comparing, ordering and rounding numbers to 10,000, and Roman Numerals to 100
- **Addition and subtraction** of 4 digit numbers using mental and written methods, estimation and checking strategies
- **Measurement:** Area
- **Multiplication and Division** facts for 3, 6, 9, 7, 11, 12 times tables

#### Year 5

- **Number and place value:** partitioning, comparing, ordering and rounding numbers to 1,000,000, powers of 10 and Roman Numerals to 1000
- **Addition and subtraction** of more than 4 digit numbers using mental and written methods, estimation and checking strategies
- **Multiplication and Division** multiples, factors, prime numbers, square and cube numbers, multiply & divide by 10, 100, 1000
- **Fractions:** equivalent fractions, convert improper fractions and mixed numbers, compare, order, add and subtract fractions

Both year groups will practise their problem solving and reasoning in all areas.



## The Tudors and Tudor England

### Creative and Expressive Arts

**Music** - To use and develop listening skills to analyse music and use this to improve composition work, using basic information from listening. To perform more complex music in parts. Be confident working in small groups

**Art** – using pencil, charcoal and pastels to create self-portraits in the Tudor style

**English** -We will be looking at the following text types  
**Diver's Daughter** – a selection of narrative and non-narrative texts including diaries, letters and newspaper reports

**Non- Fiction** – Non-chronological report based on our history and science topics

**Poetry Anthologies** – Read, memorise and perform the poems and write their own verses in the same style.

**Shakespeare** – we will look at some of Shakespeare's work in line with our topic  
We will be using the texts to focus on different aspects of grammar; features of different text types, vocabulary and syntax.

### Science – Properties of and Changing Materials

- compare and group together everyday materials based their properties,
- know that some materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution,

- demonstrate that dissolving, mixing and changes of state are reversible changes
- explain that some changes result in the formation of new materials, and that this kind of change is not usually reversible,
