

**NOTES ABOUT THE SERVICES: WE ARE STILL ENCOURAGED BY THE GOVERNMENT TO WEAR A MASK AT THE MOMENT, THOUGH IT IS NOT A LEGAL REQUIREMENT NOW.**



1. The church will be ventilated to reduce cross infection.

2. Use the sanitizer on entering the church which you will find near the door. You are to leave by the other door and to use the sanitizer at that door before leaving. Upon arrival, your names will be ticked off on the pre-prepared list which will have been drawn up.



3. In Church only sit in a pew which has a green tick. Please take this Booklet away with you: it must not be used at the next service, as they are designed to be used only once, to reduce cross infection. Everything you need for the service will be in that booklet.



4. When the service starts, please follow it in the 'one-use booklet' and at the peace, please wave, do not shake hands or hug!

5. When it comes to receiving communion, this will be in one kind only, namely the bread, to reduce infection. The Lectern side will come up first, row by row, via the central aisle. The priest will stand on the Chancel Step: please put your hands out towards the priest and he will place the bread in your hands without touching them. After receiving it into your hands, turn sideways towards the side aisles to put the bread in your mouth and walk back to your seat via those side aisles, not up the central aisle. Again, this is to reduce cross infection.



7. At the end of the service please leave by the **North Door ONLY**.



8. The collection plate will be near the door: please put your collection onto the plate. Sadly, the new Contactless Payment Machine, has been broken by vandals. **You can however still give by internet banking to 'Parish Church of St Peter' sort code 60-12-03; a/c 66609739. Please give generously, as a sign of your love for God.**

**Collection Baskets are also available at both doors.**

## ***The Order for today's Mass***

***Opening Hymn: 162 - Let all your Saints [for v 2 see 29 June]***  
*(The tune today is 'Stand up, stand up for Jesus')*

*The Priest welcomes the People and gives the Intention for this Mass*

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**

The Lord be with you  
**And also with you**

*Priest:*

ALMIGHTY God, unto whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid; Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. *Amen*

***Prayer of Confession:***

**Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour in thought, word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life, to the glory of your name. Amen**

*Priest gives Absolution:*

Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you + pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

***Gloria in Excelsis:***

Glory to God in the highest,  
**and peace to God's people on earth.**  
**Lord God, heavenly King,**  
**almighty God and Father,**  
**we worship you, we give you thanks,**  
**we praise you for your glory.**  
**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,**  
**Lord God, Lamb of God,**

**you take away the sin of the world:  
 have mercy on us;  
 you are seated at the right hand of the Father:  
 receive our prayer.  
 For you alone are the Holy One,  
 you alone are the Lord,  
 you alone are the Most High,  
 Jesus Christ,  
 with the Holy Spirit,  
 in the glory of God the Father. Amen.**

***The Collect for the Feast of St Peter:***

Almighty God, whose blessed apostle St Peter glorified you in his death as in his life: grant that your Church, inspired by his teaching and example, and made one by your Spirit, may ever stand firm upon the one foundation, Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

***Ezekiel 3:22-27***

<sup>22</sup> The hand of the Lord was on me there, and he said to me, “Get up and go out to the plain, and there I will speak to you.” <sup>23</sup> So I got up and went out to the plain. And the glory of the Lord was standing there, like the glory I had seen by the Kebar River, and I fell facedown.

<sup>24</sup> Then the Spirit came into me and raised me to my feet. He spoke to me and said: “Go, shut yourself inside your house. <sup>25</sup> And you, son of man, they will tie with ropes; you will be bound so that you cannot go out among the people. <sup>26</sup> I will make your tongue stick to the roof of your mouth so that you will be silent and unable to rebuke them, for they are a rebellious people. <sup>27</sup> But when I speak to you, I will open your mouth and you shall say to them, ‘This is what the Sovereign Lord says.’ Whoever will listen let them listen, and whoever will refuse let them refuse; for they are a rebellious people. *(pause)*

This is the word of the Lord **All: Thanks be to God**

***1 Peter 2.19-end***

2.19 For it is to your credit if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. 20 If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, where is the credit in that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God’s approval. 21 For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps. 22 ‘He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth.’ 23

When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. 24 He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. 25 For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls. *(pause)* This is the word of the Lord **All: Thanks be to God**

### **Gradual Hymn: 621 – The Church of God**

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to St Matthew

**All: Glory to you, O Lord.**

#### **Matthew 16.13-19**

16.13 Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, ‘Who do people say that the Son of Man is?’ 14 And they said, ‘Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.’ 15 He said to them, ‘But who do you say that I am?’ 16 Simon Peter answered, ‘You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.’ 17 And Jesus answered him, ‘Blessed are you, Simon, son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. 18 And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. 19 I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.’ *(pause)*

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **All: Praise to you, O Christ.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God **It is right to give thanks and praise**  
*The priest then says the **Proper Preface**, at the climax of which, all join in by saying (0800) or singing (1030):***The Sanctus:**

**Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might,**

**Heaven and earth are full of your glory.**

**Hosanna in the highest.**

**Blessed + is he who comes in the name of the Lord.**

**Hosanna in the highest**

*The priest begins the **Prayer of Consecration**, in the middle of which he says:*  
 Praise to you Lord Jesus:

**Dying you destroyed our death;**

**rising you restored our life; Lord Jesus come in glory.**

*The priest then completes the prayer, at the end of which all say: **Amen.***

***The Lord's Prayer:***

Our Father, **who art in heaven,**

**hallowed be thy name;**

**thy kingdom come;**

**thy will be done;**

**on earth as it is in heaven.**

**Give us this day our daily bread.**

**And forgive us our trespasses,**

**as we forgive those who trespass against us.**

**And lead us not into temptation;**

**but deliver us from evil.**

**For thine is the kingdom,**

**the power and the glory,**

**for ever and ever. Amen.**

***The Fraction:*** We break this bread to share in the body of Christ

**Though we are many, we are one body,**

**because we all share in one bread**

*The **Agnus Dei** is said (0800) or sung (1030):*

***The call to Holy Communion:***

Draw near and receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ, which was given for you. Take this in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

***+All receive Communion in one kind only, namely the bread***

***Post Communion Hymn: 161 - For all the saints***

***Post Communion Collect:***

Almighty God, you filled the Holy Apostle St Peter, with joy and boldness to preach the gospel: by the power of the Holy Spirit strengthen us to witness to your truth and to draw everyone to the fire of your love; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

***'Thank you prayer' after receiving Communion:***

Almighty God, **we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. Through Him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit, to live and work to your praise and glory, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen**

***The Blessing***

***Dismissal:*** Go in peace to love and serve the Lord

**In the name of Christ. Amen**

***The Mass ends with music***
