

# The Collect (Opening Prayer) for Advent Sunday

Almighty God,

give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility; that on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

## The Reading from the Old Testament – Jeremiah 33:14-16

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfil the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is the name by which it will be called: 'The Lord is our righteousness.'

# The Gospel Reading - Luke 21:25-36

Jesus said to his disciples, 'There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in a cloud" with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.'

Then he told them a parable: 'Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'

I am very grateful to the team of volunteers that counts our collection and donations and prepares the paperwork for me to enter into our accounts system. In order to make their life easier and to avoid errors with HMRC can I please ask that if you are a member of this church and in the past have completed a gift aid form then please refrain from putting your donation into a yellow envelope. Apart from the high cost of these envelopes they are a form of legal document. All the information on them as to be recorded individually and they have to be kept for 7 years. If you wish to make a Gift Aid donation please use the plain brown envelopes and simply write your donation number on it. Ideally, perhaps you would consider using the Parish Giving scheme.

If you are not a UK taxpayer you cannot submit a Gift Aid donation: if we make a Gift Aid claim for you into HMRC we will have to refund the claim back to them. So for non-taxpayers please put your donation directly into the collection plate or in an unmarked envelope. This way your donation will not be accidently submitted for Gift Aid.
