The Collect (Opening Prayer) for Mothering Sunday

God of compassion, whose Son Jesus Christ, the child of Mary, shared the life of a home in Nazareth, and on the cross drew the whole human family to himself: strengthen us in our daily living that in joy and in sorrow we may know the power of your presence to bind together and to heal; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Reading from the Old Testament – Exodus 2:1-10

A man from the house of Levi went and married a Levite woman. The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him for three months. When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him.

The daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to bring it. When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him. 'This must be one of the Hebrews' children,' she said. Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, 'Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?' Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Yes.' So the girl went and called the child's mother. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Take this child and nurse it for me, and I will give you your wages.' So the woman took the child and nursed it. When the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and she took him as her son. She named him Moses, 'because', she said, 'I drew him out of the water.'

The Gospel Reading – Luke 2:33-35

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed — and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

Some good news - a grant and a donation

We are extremely grateful to the Sussex Historic Churches Trust for awarding us a grant of £8,000 towards the Tower repairs which will be carried out later this year. We still have a way to go to find our total of nearly £100,000. Many thanks to Belle Howard who put together the successful application and who is working on other grant applications.

Also, we have received an extraordinarily generous donation of £50,000 (plus 25% Gift Aid) from Colonel Alan Jukes, now in his 90s, whose father was Churchwarden here and who gave the garden of Norton House to become our Garden of Remembrance. The donation is restricted to the upkeep of the Garden and the Churchyard and may not be used for any other purpose. It will greatly help us with maintenance and repairs for the next 10 years or so. (Did you realise that it costs around £500 per month to maintain the Churchyard?) Many thanks to the Jukes family!
