## The Collect (Opening Prayer) for the Fourth Sunday after Trinity

O God, the protector of all who trust in you, without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy: increase and multiply upon us your mercy; that with you as our ruler and guide we may so pass through things temporal that we lose not our hold on things eternal; grant this, heavenly Father, for our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

## The Reading from the New Testament - Zechariah 9: 9-12

Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. He will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the warhorse from Jerusalem; and the battle-bow shall be cut off, and he shall command peace to the nations; his dominion shall be from sea to sea. and from the River to the ends of the earth. As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your prisoners free from the waterless pit. Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope;

today I declare that I will restore to you double.

#### The Gospel Reading - Matthew 11: 16- 19, 25- end

'But to what will I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the market-places and calling to one another,

"We played the flute for you, and you did not dance;

we wailed, and you did not mourn."

For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, "He has a demon"; the Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, "Look, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax-collectors and sinners!" Yet wisdom is vindicated by her deeds.'

At that time Jesus said, 'I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

'Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.'

#### Voices in Exile

We are pleased as a church to have supported this Kemp Town-based charity which supports refugees, asylum seekers and those with no recourse to public funding with a grant of £2,000. Their funding from the Diocese was not forthcoming this year because many parishes, which rely heavily on venue hire for their main income, are not able to pay all or any of the parish share this year. The decision to support Voices in Exile was made by the Parochial Church Council with unanimous agreement. Fr Anthony

Thank you to priest and people of St Margaret's, Rottingdean for all that you have contributed to the formation of this very gifted person. Please pray for her in the apostolic work that lies ahead. I am certain that for the rest of her ministry she will pray for you, with thanksgiving.'

So, Mthr Lucy is to leave us far sooner than any of us expected. This is a very significant opportunity for her and she is excited by it. In turn, I am very pleased to be supporting her in this decision and, as the Bishop says, it is a positive reflection on the church community here that she is considered to be so well-equipped to take this step forward in her ministry. Mthr Lucy's last Sunday will be 26 July. Please pray for her as she prepares to leave us for her secondment as Curate-in-Charge at Aldwick and Pagham.
