The Collect (Opening Prayer) for the Eighth Sunday after Trinity

Almighty Lord and everlasting God,

we beseech you to direct, sanctify and govern both our hearts and bodies in the ways of your laws and the works of your commandments; that through your most mighty protection, both here and ever, we may be preserved in body and soul; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Reading from the New Testament – Isaiah 55:1-5

The LORD says this: 'Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat!

Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price.

Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labour for that which does not satisfy?

Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food.

Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live.

I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David.

See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples.

See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you, because of the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you.'

The Gospel Reading – Matthew 14:13-21

Now when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, 'This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves.' Jesus said to them, 'They need not go away; you give them something to eat.' They replied, 'We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish.' And he said, 'Bring them here to me.' Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

Public worship

The Parochial Church Council has been considering very carefully over the past weeks the possibility of resuming public worship. In their deliberations, members have been extremely concerned for the safety and health of our congregation and volunteers. It is not a unanimous decision, but a reluctant majority that agree that we will begin a Sunday Eucharist at 1000 from next Sunday, 9th August. Only 19 people have indicated that they would want to attend, and we will anyway have to restrict numbers to 30 as a maximum. By then it will be a requirement in law that a face mask is worn in church – please come prepared. You must use the hand sanitiser at the door on the way in and out, and keep 2 metres apart from anyone not in your household. You will be directed to a seat – please follow the instructions of the Churchwarden or steward. There will be no music, and guidance suggests that the service be kept as brief as possible. We will keep a record of who has attended for Track and Trace purposes. Please protect yourselves and more especially those around you. Government advice continues to be that those who are elderly or especially vulnerable should stay at home as much as possible. *Fr Anthony*
