The Collect (Opening Prayer) for Advent Sunday

Almighty God,

give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life,

in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility; that on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Reading from the New Testament – 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind—just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you— so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Gospel Reading – Mark 13:24-end

Jesus said to the disciples: 'But in those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in clouds" with great power and glory. Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven.

'From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.
'But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Eather Beware keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. It is like a man going on a

Father. Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch. Therefore, keep awake—for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake.'

DEVELOPING OUR PARISH CHURCH

A letter from the Churchwardens

Hello,

We wanted to share with you the steps we are taking to help ensure that St Margaret's Church fulfils our vision of being 'open to all'.

Our vision is a church at the centre of the community – a church serving as a cultural centre available for a variety of community activities as well as a house of prayer and worship; a church with a modern mission, accessible and welcoming to everyone.

Over the past three years, a plan has been developed that fully respects the historic importance of our beautiful church. The plan involves 're-ordering' the church interior and providing new facilities fit for church and community use in the 21st century. We aim to create a splendid open and flexible space that will transform the use of the interior. A new floor with underfloor heating is proposed (so dealing with the serious ongoing damp problems) and a kitchen, meeting rooms, improved office and fully accessible toilets and baby-change facilities are part of the plan.

The St. Margaret's Church estate includes the 'Cottage' which has for the past 32 years provided overflow accommodation for after-service coffee, Sunday School, Parochial Church Council (PCC) meetings, and a wide variety of social and group activities. Because these activities will be significantly better accommodated in the developed and more spacious church building, and because the Cottage is itself in need of very costly refurbishment, the PCC has unanimously decided that St Margaret's Cottage should be sold. The proceeds will be reinvested into the charity to enable the church development project without the need for substantial fund raising.

Other than the addition of the office/toilet block in the 1970s, this project is the most significant church building development since the 19th century – it will, we believe, ensure that St Margaret's is a truly sustainable Church serving the whole community for the generations to come. We invite you to share our vision and support us as best you can.

We would take this opportunity of wishing you a blessed Christmas – please do visit www.stmargaret.org.uk for details of our services. This year, of course, numbers are restricted because of the pandemic, and you will need to book a place in advance. Details can be found by clicking on the link to The Lookout, our weekly bulletin. You can also access our weekly recorded services via the website; there will be a special service for Christmas Day for those unable to attend in person.

The Parochial Church Council received four written submissions from members of the congregation and an e-mail to Dawn Davidson from a village resident was noted by the PCC. Others have volunteered helpful suggestions verbally.

The matter was discussed very fully and the decision was finally taken at the special PCC meeting via Zoom on 18 November, and not before then.
