#### **Dear Church Family:**

It seems such a long time since the 'old normal' which was life before lockdown. It continues to feel a strange, unprecedented time we are living through, with as-yet, no end in sight. Indeed, many are predicting that until vaccines are available, life will remain in this *liminal* state.

That said, as September begins, we are going to open both church buildings regularly for worship services and other meetings. Of course, things won't be as they were. Some won't feel able to attend due to ongoing health concerns. Those who do attend will do so under many restrictions, including wearing face coverings, no congregational singing, physical distancing, and Holy Communion with just the wafers. Nevertheless, I am looking forward to these gatherings and to being together in worship. Alongside these services, the current *church without walls* services will continue.

In this time of transition, we will continue to shape our church life around the four goals I set out as lockdown commenced, which again I commend to you:

- For the church family to remain connected and informed
- Ongoing support for the most vulnerable in our church family
- Ongoing support and help with coordination of care in the wider community
- The priority of regular prayer

In 1 Corinthians chapter 13 verse 13 Paul speaks about '...faith, hope and love'. These are wonderful qualities, worth pondering on and praying for. Hope is the cherishing of a desire with anticipation. My overriding hope is that out of the ashes of COVID-19 something new for the church will arise. It won't be a simple return to the past, but will include things familiar, alongside things currently waiting to be discovered. How might the missionary Holy Spirit be leading us out beyond the edge of our previous understandings and shapes of church? That is a question we must all ponder and pray about. It will form part of the PCC's brief as we convene again soon.

Although for now our planned services and events are all contingent on the continuing easing of lockdown restrictions, I remain hopeful that the UK church has a significant future. Indeed, who knows, perhaps the best is yet to come!
