GP/HOSPITAL APPOINTMENT ANXIETY?

IN my regular chats with our local GP surgery partners, they are very keen to stress that they are open for business and REALLY want to see people who would normally want to seek help from the surgery.

They are very conscious that patients are anxious about attending the surgery or, a hospital, but they stress that both have very strict health and hygiene measures in place and, they would be very happy to talk about any concerns with you over the phone if you are putting off going to the surgery or going to hospital.

In a recent Church Zoom Coffee morning, a church member spoke enthusiastically about their recent attendance at the John Radcliffe. Although apprehensive, they said that on arrival, they were very reassured how few people were there, especially as you are not encouraged to bring anyone inside the hospital with you, unless vital. And in the actual clinic waiting rooms, there were very few in there, and the rooms were well ventilated, no doors to open/close and everyone was wearing masks etc.

Our local GPs really want to encourage patients with a need to ideally use the EngageConsult online facility, which is actually very easy to use and only takes about 4 minutes, but if not, you can phone through and explain you cant use it online but would still like a GP to call back.

Personally, I went for my regular injection last month and because of the way they time appointments, I was the ONLY person in the left hand side of the building, the rooms smelt highly of cleaning materials, the nurse was gowned and masked, there was a one way in, one way out route, and it was all highly organised and professional.

I know from my telephone calls to older church members that they are anxious about accessing medical or nursing help at this time, but after my latest chat with the surgery, they asked me to stress how important it was that people do not put off an appointment or consultation if they feel they need it. I hope this brief summary will bring some comfort and confidence.
