#### **5 TIPS FOR FINDING REST**

"Nothing can calm our souls more or better prepare us for life's challenges than time spent alone with God." — Billy Graham

REST is a Biblical concept. God the Father did it. Jesus did, too, during His time here on earth. And so should we.

Whether you have a few moments or a few days to spare, consider the following 5 tips as you carve out some time to rejuvenate your spirit.

## 1. Unplug from social media and the news

Screen addiction is a real thing, and while these avenues may be informative, they're also competing for your emotional and spiritual bandwidth. Give it a rest for an hour, a day, a week—whatever you can realistically spare.

Romans 12:2: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.".

#### 2. Take a nap. Or go to bed early

Physical rest cannot be underemphasized for your emotional and spiritual health. Feeling guilty that you won't be as productive? Remember, God rested after creating the world. Jesus slept peacefully in the middle of a violent storm (Mark 4:37-39), and He intentionally took a break from the crowds to rest, too (Matthew 14:32). Mark 6:31: "And he [Jesus] said to them [His disciples]: 'Come away by yourselves to a desolate place and rest awhile.' For many were coming and going and they had no leisure even to eat."

#### 3. Go for a walk, and pay attention to God's creation

God feeds the birds and dresses the flowers (Matthew 6:25-34). "Are you not much more valuable than they?" Think about that as you walk through your neighbourhood or simply sit and gaze from your back

porch. Luke 5:16: "But he [Jesus] would withdraw to desolate places and pray."

#### 4. Spend time with God

Pray first. Ask Him to reveal Himself. Then open your Bible and read intentionally, asking God to speak to you. James 4:8: "Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you."

#### 5. Express your heart for the Father

Journal. Paint. Dance. Break out the tools and get crafty. Whatever you do, do it unto the Lord (Colossians 3:23), as your expression of love for Him.

Deuteronomy 6:5: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might."

Remember, you are His beloved creation (Jeremiah 31:3). Keep that truth with you as you conclude your time of rest.

# ALLOTMENTS FOR THE DISABLED & FAMILY GROUPS

THE public Purposes Charity manages the village allotments and the Committee now want to gauge public interest in providing new facilities differing from standard allotments. These would be part and parcel of a new allotment area, needed in any case to meet rising demand in the village.

Plots for residents with disabilities would be smaller than normal, would have easy wheelchair access and could offer other help such as raised beds – according to need.

There has also been recent interest in smaller plots for family groups, where parents would introduce their children to gardening skills.

The diversity of the fourth age provides great opportunity for churches and Christian faith organisations; this

guidance gives some ideas to churches for different ministries, outreach and mission among older people.
