People with symptoms	Adult helpers or children wanting to attend may have symptoms.	Follow government advice for identifying symptoms in adults and children and don't let them attend if they exhibit them.	Generally, this is a persistent cough, high temperature or loss of taste or smell.
Cleanliness of hall and equipment, especially after other hires	Other hirers or hall cleaner have not cleaned hall or equipment used to standard required. Our group leaves hall or equipment without cleaning.	Hall is cleaned Monday to Friday in mornings. Risk that high touch surfaces aren't cleaned.  Team to wipe high touch surfaces when they open up such as door handles.  Team to wipe down tables with disinfectant spay before putting away.
