

# PE & Sport Premium Funding

## 2015-16

In order to continue the legacy of the 2012 London Olympic Games, the government has allocated 'Sport Premium' funding to schools, which is to be used purely on P.E.

In 2015-16 the school has received £3,502 in PE & Sports Grant funding to date. This has been supplemented by a carry forward of £2,150 from the previous financial year, making a total income of £5,652.

**This money will be used to help provide support in the following ways:**

- ✓ To employ experts to train staff to have more expertise and confidence in delivering a wider variety of sports
- ✓ To facilitate the development of dance within the curriculum, linked to our Creative Arts Curriculum Driver and delivery of Arts Award across the school
- ✓ To raise achievement in P.E. lessons
- ✓ To inspire children not yet engaged in P.E.
- ✓ To enter more competitions, particularly the school games competitions
- ✓ Buy more resources
- ✓ Support the leadership and management of PE
- ✓ To work in partnership with other schools

**Provision is currently being provided by:**

- Funding a specialist P.E. coach, Darren Beech, from Sports Jam for a day per week
- For Darren to work alongside staff for 1 day per week to develop staff expertise in planning & delivery a variety of disciplines
- In addition, for Darren to undertake lesson observations each half term and provide constructive feedback to staff and to feedback summary findings to the P.E Co-ordinator and the Headteacher; and in turn provide actions for future development
- To access wider participation in competitions such as KS2 School Games Day
- For younger children in LKS2 to experience an activity day before attending a residential trip in UKS2
- To facilitate wider participation in the annual Swimming Gala, competing with other local schools
- To develop the confidence and expertise of the P.E. Co-ordinator by attending an annual PE Conference, networking with colleagues from other local schools
- To facilitate the auditing and acquisition of resources
- To train a member of staff to achieve the Archery GB Award and to provide a club using the recently purchased Arrows Archery Kit
- To enhance curriculum delivery by sourcing specialist practitioners to deliver workshops for children across the school

The projected expenditure from April 2015 - December 2015 is £6,280.

This will exceed our current income by £728.

We anticipate that the school will receive an additional allocation of approximately £5,000 for the remainder of the financial year in due course.

**If your child does not have Free School Meals, but may be eligible because of your family's income level, please contact the office in confidence, to register them.
