Hello everyone,

I hope you are all keeping safe and well in these challenging times.

I would kindly draw your attention to the information in the latest government document on social distancing. This can be found at:

This is the current guidance while we are in this second period of lockdown.

It clearly details the recommendations for social distancing. It states that to reduce the risk of catching or spreading Covid-19 that you should ensure that you are two metres apart from anyone not in your household or support bubble. An infected person can pass on the virus even if they do not have any symptoms, through talking and breathing as well as coughing or sneezing. When with people you do not live with, you should also avoid physical contact, being close to them and being face-to-face.

Please follow this guidance carefully when entering our school grounds for drop-off and pick-up and when exiting through the Village Hall grounds.

As of today, there will be a few minor changes to collection arrangements. This is part of heightened risk management measures that we are putting in place at school due to the rising prevalence of Covid-19 in Shropshire.

For Elm and Ash classes collection points will remain the same at pick-up.

For Oak Class, there will now be a coned area outside of the class base through which children will be dismissed at the end of the school day. Staff dismissing the children will remain in the doorway of the classroom.

A coned area will also be in place at the side door to Fir and again staff will remain in the doorway of the classroom.

Please arrive at school at your designated departure time. The times are as follows:

Surnames beginning A to E : 3:05 pm Surnames beginning F to O : 3:15 pm Surnames beginning P to Z : 3.25 pm

We are seeing an increasing number of children being collected at the earlier collection time and this is causing some congestion between 3.05 and 3.15 pm. If numbers continue at this high level, we will be have to unfortunately limit the number of parents passing through the side green gate by the playing field in order to reduce the congestion that is beginning to

arise on the KS1 playground. Sadly, this will result in a longer queuing time along the school path and through the gate and across the car park.

Thank you for your continued support in trying to keep our school as safe as possible through this difficult and challenging time.

Last December we sent 10 boxes of books to be shipped to Uganda. We have just heard from Gill Castle, one of the trustees, that our books were part of 3,000 books on their way to the libraries in the villages of Rushaga, Ruhija, Nyakeina and Murushasha. Before the pandemic, Omushana continued to promote reading through taking Book Boxes and reading stories to children at the remote schools. They visit over 3000 children in more than 30 schools every month. Since late March all the libraries and schools have been closed, but the 'Fun with Books' programmes are ready to restart in 2021.
