This remains the current guidance while we are in this second period of lockdown.

It outlines the current recommendations for social distancing in order to reduce the risk of catching or spreading Covid-19 which apply to everyone in all aspects of their daily lives.

Of particular note are the following points that could impact at drop-off and pick-up times.

A contact would be identified as:

- a person who has had face-to-face contact (within one metre), with someone who has
 tested positive for COVID-19, including being coughed on, having a face-to-face
 conversation within one metre or having skin-to-skin physical contact this could be
 when queuing outside the school gates for example or when moving around the
 perimeter of the school building.
- a person who has had contact within one metre for one minute or longer without faceto-face contact -this could be when queuing behind someone else outside the school gates for example or when following someone around the perimeter of the school building.
- a person who has been within 2 metres of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 for more than 15 minutes this could be when having a chat with a friend.
- a person who has travelled in a small vehicle with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 this could be when sharing a lift with someone.

Please continue to follow these two sets of guidance carefully when coming to and from school and entering our school grounds for drop-off and pick-up and when exiting through the Village Hall grounds.

Thank you for your continued support in trying to keep our school as safe as possible through this difficult and challenging time.
