This week is Assessment Week in school. All children in Years 1 to 6 will be taking part in assessments in reading, writing, grammar, punctuation & spelling and mathematics. Children in Reception will be completing their baseline assessments.

Children in Year 2 will also be undertaking a Phonics Screening Check over the next couple of weeks as they were unable to complete this as Year 1 last summer due to a change in the assessment regulations due to Covid-19.

A reminder that Parent Consultations will be taking place in January rather than the end of this term. This is a change to our usual reporting cycle as the children undertook assessments back in September, with Parent Consultations by phone taking place after this assessment period.

Children are welcome to come dressed in their party clothes and stay in them all day to avoid bringing a change of clothes.


Unfortunately this year we will be unable to accept donations of party food but the children will still have plenty of fun and games in their bubbles.
