### Dear Friends,

We are all living in an unprecedented time. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the government has put the country in lockdown. Most are advised to stay home. Many public places, including our church, are still closed and we do not know when we can again open our doors to the public. In the UK alone, we have over 216,500 cases already and over 28,200 deaths. The way of life around the world has changed. The situation has affected not only humans, but also the animals and the environment. Wild animals and wild plants are now starting to appear even in urban areas. World economy is down but also air pollution. Some people use the time to learn new skills at home. Some use it to bond more with their family. Some are experiencing difficulties financially, socially, physically and/or mentally. And we ask everyone to remember these people in our prayers. We also urge everyone to pray for all our brave frontline workers (the doctors, nurses, hospital staff, drivers, grocers, pharmacists, police officers, etc) who are constantly risking their lives every day just to be able to help us survive this pandemic. Clapping for them every Thursday evening is a good gesture but meaningful prayers will also be appreciated.

## **Services / Events**

The government is asking us to stay at home, protect the NHS and save lives. Our church will remain closed until further notice. Medical experts are now saying that social distancing might take up to 6 months to curb the infection of the Covid-19 virus. All our lunchtime recitals, including the Summer Music Festival in August are now cancelled until further notice. This is to ensure the safety of all people involved in them, not only the performers, but also the volunteers and audiences. We will resume our weekly services as soon as the lockdown is lifted by the government. All other services and events booked with us in May until June are also cancelled. Some of these events/services might be rescheduled on later dates this year. Please watch this space or in our website for further announcement.

#### **Fabric**

The Covid-19 situation has meant that the timing of the big restoration project will also be delayed. The design team are still working (they are on home working as well) but the immediate problem is that the work was due to go out to tender and that can't happen while people cannot do site visits. We are not yet clear what the exact implications will be, but it likely that the work will not start for 3 to 4 months beyond the projected date of January 2021. We will keep everyone posted as more clarity appears. You may well know that Sue and I will have to move when the work starts as we can't live in a building site, and the Diocese is continuing to work on where we might be able to relocate to.

# **Livery work**

My Chaplaincy work continues with the City of London Corporation and the Livery companies. It looks rather different, but I am staying in touch with key people in all the organisations and seeking to offer support where it is requested. Please continue to pray that these links are useful and that where pastoral care is offered I am able to deliver.
