**Data Privacy**

Some folk have voiced surprise that contact addresses, phone numbers, or email addresses do not appear in newsletter articles. This is in an effort to protect everyone's privacy and for the church to fulfill its legal obligations under the data protection act.

To protect everyone, we only publish contact names in the newsletter updates: we do not publish personal email addresses, phone numbers, or home addresses. If you know how to get in touch with the named contact using the Parish Contact list or My ChurchSuite, great. Otherwise, please contact the Church Office. Please consider how you want people to contact you when submitting an article or notice for the newsletter.

It is especially important when putting forward a name for prayer in the newsletter, that the person has given permission for their name to be in the public domain. Normally, if possible, any names submitted are contacted by a member of the pastoral team, or their family is contacted, to ensure the person is happy for their name to appear in public. We can always abbreviate the surname or first name to a single initial if required - God will know who is meant when we pray.

### John & Netty Shea Farewell tea

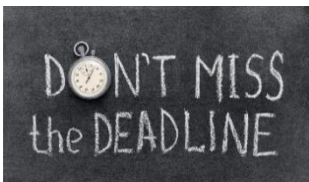

Whether you have joined in 'Thy Kingdom Come' before or not, we invite you to take part – along with churches from over 80 different denominations & traditions in nearly 90% of countries (172) around the world.
