## SEBA Training

### **Update on First Aid certificates:**

Here is the latest from the HSE. They are now suggesting you need to show you are planning for the future - with that in mind, would any churches needing either new, or to renew, First Aid at Work certificates, please contact Pam Kerley ([pam.admin@seba-baptist.org.uk](mailto:pam.admin@seba-baptist.org.uk)) to register their interest in obtaining the training once it becomes available, as we are looking at provisional dates with our trainer (clearly demonstrating the first criteria - as outlined below - if you are relying on the extension from the HSE):

*"FAW or EFAW certificates that expired after 16 March 2020 can remain valid until 31 October 2020 or 6 months from date of expiry, whichever is later. All*

*requalification training for these certificates should be completed by 31 March 2021.*

*To qualify for the extension, employers must be able to demonstrate that:*

- 1. they have made every effort to arrange requalification training as soon as possible and can explain in detail why they have not been able to do so. For example, they must show evidence that staff with expired certificates are booked on to EFAW or FAW requalification courses, if requested by an inspector*
- 2. they have adequate and appropriate equipment and facilities to give first aid to any employee who is injured or becomes ill at work*
- 3. the level of first aid cover provided remains appropriate for their particular work environment"*

### **Joint Public Issues Team - EU Settlement Scheme:**

There are over 3.5 million EU nationals who call the UK their home. As churches we want to create a society which welcome everyone, valuing the contribution and presence of everyone in our congregations and communities. We want to honour the instruction in Leviticus to make our communities welcoming spaces:

*When a foreigner resides among you in your land, do not mistreat them. The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt.*

Leviticus 19:33-4

But in order for EU citizens to stay in the UK after we leave the EU, they have to apply for a new immigration status, referred to EU Settled Status, by the 30th June 2021.

There has been some concern from campaigners that it may be more difficult for some more vulnerable EU citizens to apply for this scheme: people may not realise they need to apply, or may lack the necessary documentation. The process is also online, which can be more difficult for some people.

We've produced a booklet aimed at church leaders and those who work in the community which signposts some of the available support and outlines the process of application, including information about who in your community or congregation might need support.
