As a temporary measure (until we are able to return to face-to-face training) the Baptist Union have brought out an Excellence in Safeguarding Update film.

The Safeguarding Update film covers the key points of both Level 2 and Level 3 training and is accompanied by a Resources Pack that you can download as a PDF. It lasts for 90 minutes and there is a break point in the middle.

This film is for everyone. If you have attended one of our training courses before, we hope that you find the film of help as an update and reminder. If you are new this will get you started in understanding Safeguarding in our Churches.

Important changes to the registration of marriages!!!!

The Civil Partnerships, Marriages and Deaths (Registration etc.) Act 2019 - the Act had successfully completed its passage through Parliament and attained Royal Assent on 26 March 2019.

The House of Lords approved the draft Registration of Marriages Regulations 2021 on 23 March 2021 - and the new regulations will come into force on 4 May 2021; meaning as from 4th May 2021, the registration of marriages will become electronic

Coronavirus Essential Guidance:

The Government updated the Places of Worship guidance for England on Friday (see link below). BUGB are updating their guidance today, but there are important changes to singing from 28 March:

Indoors: small groups of singers will be allowed to perform, or rehearse for performance, only where essential to an act of communal worship. This should be limited to as few singers as possible

Outdoors: in the grounds or the outside space of a place of worship: when communal worship takes

place outdoors, the congregation may join in with singing, and should follow the principles set out in the Performing Arts guidance (see link below). It is important to note that you must still adhere to social distancing and gathering rules, meaning before 29 March people should not mix outside of their household or support bubble.

Praise report from Northern Israel

In the last few months, we sent information about a unique opportunity to partner with us by helping revitalize the church in Rama, a strategic location in the north of Israel. This church was planted in 1962, but the congregation has not been able to use the church property for over 15 years, because the children of the previous pastor (now deceased) refused to vacate it. The church has been meeting in a rented hall since then.

We are now excited to share that the property in Rama is now clear to be used for ministry again!

The tenants left the place in bad shape, and it needs to be renovated. We have shown love to them and we pray God will bless them as they begin their life in a new place.

We are grateful for our partners at BCI (the local ministry of the Southern Baptist Convention) for their amazing perseverance to make this happen. We are thankful for churches and individuals who gave generously to support this effort. More funds are still needed to replenish the funds ABC used from its limited reserves to pay the previous tenants, as agreed by all parties involved.

Rama Baptist Church and other ABC churches already began the cleanup process with joy, in preparation for going back to worship the Lord in the place again. We are grateful first and foremost to God who allowed us to see this day!

Personally, I had tears of joy when we first arrived at the location as I have worked for almost two decades to see this day! It was indeed a historical day in the life of Baptists in Israel.

We can now say with Nehemiah: *“The God of heaven Himself will prosper us; therefore we, His*

servants will arise and build" (Nehemiah 2:20)

Thank you for being part of making history, which is His story.
