Cross Keyring



- 1. Thread the string through the wooden cross
 - 2. Put both ends of the thread through each of the beads.
- 2. Tie the ends of the string to the metal ring securely, an adult could help with tying a double knot in the end.

Easter Garden

Tip the bag of soil into the black tray (we put a sheet of kitchen roll in the bottom as there are holes in the tray).

Place your pot into the soil and cover the 'top of the' pot with soil to create 'a hill'.

Go outside to find some stones (one larger to make a door for the tomb and smaller ones to make a pathway) or anything else you want to add to your garden.

Make the lollysticks into crosses and add these to your garden.

Sprinkle to grass seed onto your garden. Watch your grass grow.



Communion—Bread and Grape Juice

Communion is a very important to Christians. Jesus introduced this idea to the disciples at the Last Supper before he went to the cross. They were all sitting down for a meal when Jesus talked to them about what was going to happen. Jesus picked up some bread and broke it into smaller pieces and said, "This is my body that will be broken for you." Then he picked up the drink and said, "This is my blood that will be spilled for you." The disciples were confused. Why was Jesus talking about being broken and his blood being spilled?

Jesus was telling them he knew was going to be arrested, put in jail, beaten and put on a cross to die. Jesus wanted the disciples to understand why that was happening, which is so that Jesus could pay for our sins. He was choosing to do this for our sake and for the

sake of everyone, ever!

Communion is symbolic, like a picture, of what Jesus did for us. So, at churches all over the world, we use bread to remind us that his body was broken for us and we

drink grape juice to remember that his blood was given for our sins. We do this to remember Jesus' sacrifice for everyone; for us!

If you like, you could take part in your own communion at home with the bread and juice provided, you can put the juice into the glass.

When you drink it, you might find it helpful to read



Easter Story wheel

- 1. Colour in the pictures on page 2.
- 2. Cut around the <u>outside</u> of your circle on page 1 and 2 and the triangle on page 1.
 - 3. Fix the wheels together with the enclosed paper fastener.
 - 4. Spin the wheel to learn parts of the Easter story.



Make an Easter card

Making an Easter story box

Jesus washes his disciples' feet

...so he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him.

When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you.
