Jesus power can transform peoples lives and give them a fresh start. Make a caterpillar to remind you of transformation ...


- 1. Tie a good sized knot in one end of your strawberry lace
 - 2. Slide the loops onto the lace.
- 3. Poke the other end into the marshmallow head.
 - 4. Add the antennae
 - 5. Enjoy! (maybe take a photo first? ...)



Push pop spring box—Blind/Healed man!

Make yourself a changing puppet to remind you of the way jesus transformed this mans life!

- Colour all the three parts of the craft first.
- Cut out all the pieces, you might need some help from an adult especially with the window over his eyes.
- Fold along all the solid straight lines including the tabs. On the strip with no pictures on only lines you need to fold the two end tabs the opposite way to the lines in the middle (it should look like legs with feet).
- Start with the man with the eyes on. Glue the tab on the inside and fold into a square.
- Take the piece with the man which has no eyes, turn it over so the writing is facing down. Glue the middle of the leg shaped piece to the back of the writing.
- Then glue all the tabs and stick so the tabs are on the outside of the box.
- Slide the piece with the man with the eyes inside the piece with the man with the no eyes ensuring that the faces line up. The feet shape piece should be in the middle.
- Slide the man with the eyes down so that the bottom edge lines
 - up with the black line on the feet.
- Glue the tabs and stick it to the outside of the box.
- Then the man should pop up and down.



Felt Butterfly

The butterfly is a great reminder that transformation and change can be beautiful and life changing! Make a reminder that Jesus can change our lives forever and hang it up somewhere you'll see it often.



Instructions:

- . Take the two circles of felt.
- . Pinch them in the middle and hold the two circles together.
- . Wrap the pipe cleaner around them to hold them together.
- . Make antennas from the ends of the pipe cleaners.


As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?"

How to make your glasses

- 1. Colour in your glasses.
- 2. Carefully cut around the edge of your glasses, including the top part.
 - 3. Now fold the top part over your glasses.



'Thinking of you' card

In this month's story, we heard about a man born blind who was healed by Jesus.

One thing I do know. I was blind but now I see! John 9 v 25

We may not be physically blind but meeting Jesus will help us to see things in a new way and help us to try to care for people as he did.

Although we celebrate 'New Year' on 1st January, September is the start of a new year for many of us. We may be starting a new school year, maybe a new school or maybe going to school for the first time. This results in new experiences for mums and dads too!

There is probably someone you know about to embark on a new adventure. Make a 'Thinking of you' card for them. You will find most of what you need for this craft in coloured envelope with the paper clip.

Put a little pocket on the front of the card which contains a wooden heart.


You can do this by making up the small envelope using sellotape.











Alternatively, you can glue around just three edges of the small piece of paper (shown by the arrows) leaving the top open.

Your friend can remove the heart and carry it with them to remind them they are not alone.

You can use the stickers to decorate your card or anything else you have at home. Write a message inside the card. This will vary depending on when their new start is or was. Write your friend's name on the envelope card, put the card in and deliver some encouragement!

Keep the other heart and use it as a reminder to pray for that person and check in with them about how they are getting on.





New creation Butterfly Verse

Extra Ideas for at home ...

What's in the pillowcase

Find a selection of safe objects your child will be familiar with.

When they are not looking, place one inside a pillowcase.

Allow your child to feel around inside the case and try to guess what the object is without seeing it.

Remind your child that the blind man could not see. Speak about how this made many things more difficult for him.

Then speak about how it would be different when he could see!

Chat about the change Jesus made and whether we think Jesus could make changes like this in our lives or the lives of those we know.
