



Our annual Animal Service took place on Sunday 2nd October this year. Dogs of all shapes and sizes, guinea pigs, hamsters and even a litter of newborn kittens were brought to Church for a blessing. The blessing of animals in churches originated in the thirteenth century to coincide with the feast day of St Francis of Assisi, patron saint of animals and the environment.

St Peter's applied to become Animal Friendly Church last year; in fact the Anglican Society for the Welfare of Animals were so impressed with our application that we were chosen to be the winners of their Animal Friendly Church Award for 2015 and they sent us a hamper!

Our Parish Events Team organise a wide variety of events throughout the year - from a faith lunch to welcome the new Vicar and his family; to fundraisers like the Christmas Fair. 
What is a Christingle?

This year there will be three Christingle Services at St Peter's Church on Christmas Eve at 3:00 pm, 4:00 pm and 5:00 pm. The Children's Society first introduced the Christingle service to the Church of England in 1968; since then the funds raised are vital in supporting their work with vulnerable and disadvantaged children.



Christingle actually means *Christ Light* and celebrates the light of Jesus coming into the world. The orange is round like the world. The candle stands tall and gives light in the darkness like the love of God. The red ribbon goes all around the world and symbolizes the blood of Christ, shed when He died for us. The four sticks point to the four corners of the world— north, south, east and west. The fruit and nuts (or sometimes sweets!) represent God's gifts to us, including the fruits of the earth. Posada is coming to St Peter's



Posada is a traditional Mexican celebration, commemorating Mary and Joseph's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem in their search for *posada*, a Spanish word for *shelter* or *inn*. In recent years the idea

has been taken up by Christian churches and schools in other countries. During Advent, figures of Mary and Joseph travel around the area visiting a different family or place every night.

This year, St Peter's is going to celebrate Posada. The Vicar, Alan Garrow, and his family have agreed to be the first hosts of the figures at the Vicarage. Then every night during Advent the figures will visit a different home, giving the family a unique opportunity to remember the true meaning of Christmas with their friends and neighbours. They might also retell the Christmas story, say prayers, sing carols or share mince pies. At the end of Advent the figures will return to St Peter's Church on Christmas Day finally finding posada.
