Thy Kingdom Come – a call to pray

'They all joined together constantly in prayer' (*Acts 1.14*) describes the action of the disciples and Mary, following the Ascension of Jesus into heaven, it was all they felt able to do, asking for guidance and strength for whatever might come next. As believers we are invited to follow their example in the ten days from Ascension until Pentecost (30th May to 9th June this year), to think of five of our *not-yet-believing* friends, and to pray for each of them to come to know the love of Jesus for themselves.



Prayer is a most vital communication tool in our relationship with God; it has the power to transform lives and to change hearts and minds and should be as easy as chatting to a close friend. Our conversations with God don't need to be long, complicated affairs, we can pray simply:

Loving Lord I pray for my friend (name) to come to

know you, please encourage them to walk with You. Amen.

Remember: conversing with God is more important than the actual words we use!

To help us in this call to pray for our friends we will have some activities on offer in Church, as visual reminders of our commitment. During the intercessions (at some services) we will be getting crafty with bracelets and paper chains (more exciting than it sounds, I promise) and in the windows you can use candles to illuminate Christ's light for your friends. And look out for more besides.

Food parcels are available from 4:45 pm every day, except for Sundays, when it's 5:30 pm.




Hope of our calling – marking the 25th anniversary of the ordination of women

A special service to mark the 25th anniversary of the ordination of women to the priesthood in the Church of England will take place at Ripon Cathedral at 3:30 pm on Sunday 16th June, when the Bishop of Ripon, the Rt Revd Dr Helen-Ann Hartley will be preaching.

Notre Dame Fundraiser: screening of the classic silent film

On 10th July Ripon Cathedral is screening the 1923 version of *The Hunchback of Notre Dame*, with an improvised organ accompaniment by Tim Harper, who is Assistant Director of Music at the Cathedral. In the wake of the fire at Notre Dame in April, a proportion of the profits will go towards the restoration fund to rebuild the Cathedral in Paris. There will be an open bar throughout the evening and the chance to see the organist performing, projected alongside the silent black and white film.

Refreshments will be served from 8:30 pm and the performance starts at 9:00 pm. Tickets are £10 and available from the Cathedral Shop.
