## Altar Frontals – the next stage

In 2019 the Parochial Church Council (PCC) set up the Altar Frontals Commissioning Group to oversee the renewal of our liturgical textiles. The full set of textiles for the Lent/Advent season include the altar frontal, three priest stoles, a pulpit fall, and a burse and veil. These textiles mark the changing seasons of the Church's year and provide a means of expressing the vision and values of St Peter's. The Commissioning Group created a detailed brief and, after a series of interviews, recommended that the PCC appoint the highly experienced textile designer, Polly Meynell. 

## Racial Justice Service

Last Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> September at 2:00 pm the Cathedrals of the Diocese of Leeds – Bradford, Ripon and Wakefield - released a programme of perspectives, prayers, music and Bible readings on the theme of racial justice. It draws together material that has been


significant in this summer of protest, including the great West Indian fast bowler Michael Holding's moving interview on Sky.

In the service there will be short addresses by Bishop Nick Baines, Bishop Tony Parry (New Testament Church of God) and Professor Udy Archibong (University of Bradford). Musical items include 'Something Has to Break' from the InterVarsity Christian Fellowship and 'It Is Enough', sung by Pastor R. DeAndre Johnson, a piece originally written in 2016 at the deaths of Alton Sterling and Philando Castille, but now a hymn used as a song of lament for all black sons and daughters who have been harmed and vilified by the justice system. There will also be prayers and biblical texts read by adults and children across the three cathedrals.

The service has been designed to be used by individuals and churches, perhaps with a Zoom discussion afterwards. A further reading list of three books, for further discussion, is included at the close of the service.

The Dean of Bradford, Jerry Lepine, says, "This summer light has been shone on a shocking aspect of human existence. Racism is insidious and runs deep. Many of us have been challenged to think far more profoundly about it than before. This programme has been made to challenge, provoke, inspire and bring us closer to God's vision for a healed humanity. And yes, to speak up and act as well. It is offered by the Cathedrals as a gift to the Diocese."
