Is it really all that important?

- Three bibles are sold every second. (That's almost 274 thousand a day)
- There are 365 verses that say 'do not fear'
- It contains 66 books written by 40 authors in 3 languages (Hebrew, Greek, Aramaic) living in 3 continents (Asia, Africa, Europe).
- There are 31,000 verses containing 185 songs.
- In its entirety it has been translated into 698 different, but the New testament has been translated into 1,548 languages.

What is the Bible for?

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servants of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.
