MINISTER'S LETTER

Revd Matthew Trick

JOY AND HAPPINESS

Are you feeling full of joy at the moment? Possibly not. Though I am, which is not to say I am always happy at present as that would often be mixed, but I am joyful. Joy is one of the characteristics of a life lived with God that the Apostle Paul mentions in Galatians 5.22-23 where he talks about the fruits of a spirit-filled life. You might want to grab your bibles, or use a Bible app on your phone to note what doesn't make the cut. Can you spot happiness anywhere in that passage? Of all the specific characteristics of a spirit-filled life that Paul notes surely happiness would make the cut?

Instead, joy get included and joy is a very different thing to happiness. Let me tell you what's bringing me the most joy at the moment: looking forward with great anticipation to the ordination of Sandra as a Deacon and Kay as a Priest. It is a source of immense joy to me to be involved in the formation of two wonderful people who have both said 'yes' to God. It is also a source of amazement and wonder to me that two people whose life journeys have been so different have both found themselves in our Benefice because of their saying 'yes' to God.

I don't want to unnerve any further Sandra and Kay who might read this



article before being ordained, but the ordination charge given to both deacons and priests is serious stuff. To see two people, among others on the journey of vocation, who are prepared to enter this way of life is in itself a joyful thing indeed.

Jesus, after teaching his disciples on the Christian way of life told them, 'These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.' (John 15:11, NKJV). In Philippians, Paul writes: 'Then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind.' (Philippians 2:2-4, NKJV). There is a lot of good bible study we could do around these verses but for now, just know; God wants you to have joy!

At the heart of the difference between joy and happiness is the reality that we choose joy but feel happiness. Pause your reading of this article for a moment or two and call to mind the last time you

were happy. You might recall a brief moment even in the last couple of hours when you were aware of feeling happiness or your mind might take you back to a more significant occasion. Wherever your memories and mind take you we have arrived at our first key difference between happiness and joy: happiness is reactive and nearly always temporary, whereas joy is cultivated and once cultivated endures during good and bad times.

Happiness is great, we all love to be happy and this article in no way is an attempt to downplay the place of happiness in our lives. After the 15 months that we have just had, I wish everyone who reads this, all the happiness in the world. And there is no 'but' coming, just a recognition that happiness is so often associated with pleasure which comes and goes. We might feel happy because a friend or family member has said something deeply affirming. By now most readers will know me well enough to know that my happiness is inextricably related to the state of my stomach. Recently, Sarah and I managed a date afternoon and evening and went to a restaurant we both love in Dorchester. The food was fantastic, and I felt happy.

So taking pleasure in things and people is a source of happiness but what now about joy. Well, joy like happiness is an emotion. We can feel it just like we can feel happiness. In fact we use phrases like 'crying tears of joy' when we are overcome with the emotion of joy. Interestingly the dictionary definitions differ on what joy is. Some describe joy as simply a heightened state of happiness or pleasure, whereas others point us to a

wider understanding of joy, suggesting joy is about a state of success or satisfaction.

These dictionary definitions are helpful, but you might like me be wondering how our faith in Jesus relates to our longing for joy. Good news, the two are linked. I have already quoted the words of both Jesus and St Paul earlier which give you the sense that the bible has a lot to say about joy. Recently a Twitter friend challenged her followers to offer a definition of lament as she was due to speak about lament at a conference later that day and was taking soundings. I, in a rare moment of inspiration, tweeted back 'lament is the crying of the soul for the restoration of God's vision for the world.' It occurs to me that joy and lament are two sides of the same coin. If lament is about our souls agonising over the suffering, prejudice, and poverty of the world around us, contrary to the world envisioned and created by God, then joy is the hope of our souls for a world resembling the goodness of God.

I have been known to have 'twee' moments in services where I might invite a congregation to respond to the words 'God is good!' by saying 'All the time!' to which I then repeat 'All the time!' and they conclude 'God is good!'. The responsory is a little twee but in the right moment can always point people to the ever-present goodness of God and even (challenging point) in all situations. For Christians, joy is an enduring state of response to the goodness of God, which is not as fleeting as happiness or pleasure but can endure even in the midst of hardship.

So here are some tips if you wish to cultivate the practice of joy in your daily lives:

1. Keep up the spiritual disciplines of prayer and bible reading. Because prayer orients us to an awareness of God's presence and bible reading helps us to bring the verses and passages, we read to bear on the situations we face daily.

2. Try to ruthlessly eliminate hurry and busyness from your days. Your day might be full of events and tasks, but hurry and busyness are states of mind rather than an indication of reality. Hurry is the enemy of joy because it robs our awareness of God's goodness in the present moment and denies us the opportunity to respond with joy.

3. Keep a journal. No one need ever see it, nor do you have to write extensively, a sentence a day will suffice. But journaling helps us reflect on where God has been in our encounters that day. Over time you can look back and see God's presence in your daily life. This reflection and awareness aid the cultivation of joy.

4. This next tip is probably covered in the first, but I want to be more specific: pray daily to be filled with the Holy Spirit, because joy is a fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5).

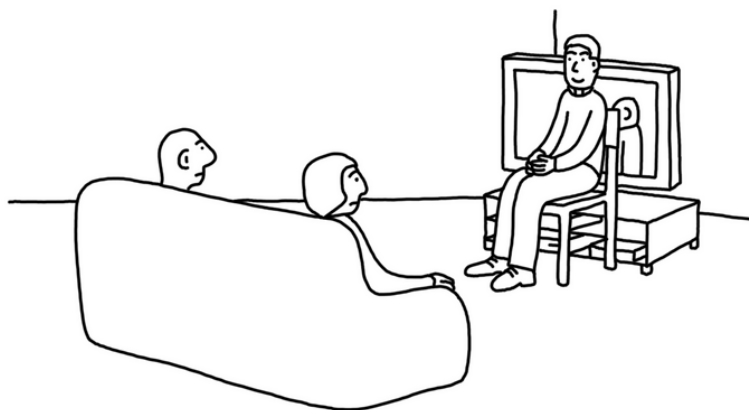

ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

The Diocesan Net Zero Strategy aims to reach net zero carbon emissions by 2030 in line with the national church's target agreed at General Synod in 2020.

The Diocesan strategy sets sustainability targets for churches, schools, clergy housing and diocesan offices including the off-setting of carbon, installing electric vehicle charging points, using low-carbon heating systems, and optimising the energy efficiency of buildings.

One of the key goals is for 90% of parishes to have switched to a green energy supplier by December 2021.

The paper outlines six key commitments of the Diocese to:

- take the environmental impact and use of resources fully into account in all areas of work,
- embrace more and more a spirit of Christian joy and fullness of life,
- strive to adapt individual lives to be fully sustainable,
- seek to increase awareness and understanding of environmental issues in local communities,
- accept a wider responsibility towards young people and minority groups,
- recognise that efforts committed will have to be sustained for successors and promote generational change

The Diocesan Environmental Group (DEG) encouraging parishes to 'Care for God's Creation'

The DEG believe that care for the environment is fundamental to Christian

faith and action. As stewards of God's gift of creation each of us has a responsibility to ensure that this remains a sustainable world and to respond to the social injustice visited on many of the world's poorest people as a result of climate change.

To this end as a Diocese we affirm the 5th Mark of Mission agreed at the 1988 Lambeth Conference which asks all churches to 'strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and to sustain and renew the life of earth' as central to our work and mission.

Eco Church and Eco Diocese

In 2019, Winchester Diocese was awarded the A Rocha Eco Diocese Bronze Award recognising their commitment to good environmental and ethical stewardship. They are now working towards achieving the Silver Award. To help parishes take practical steps in embracing 'Caring for God's Creation' the DEG recommend participation with Eco Church.

Eco Church offers a free online survey, supported and endorsed by the Church of England, with supporting resources designed to equip your church to express your care for God's world in your worship and teaching; in how you look after your buildings and land; in how you engage with your local community and in global campaigns, and in the personal lifestyles of your congregation.

The actions you take will count towards a prestigious Eco Church Award at Bronze, Silver or Gold level. Many parishes are already using Eco Church; to find out more please speak to a warden.



DIOCESE OF KINKIIZI - CHURCH OF UGANDA



EMERGENCY COVID FUND FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT IN KINKIIZI

Uganda is currently suffering high numbers of Covid cases as the Delta variant overwhelms them. Many cases are being diagnosed everywhere including in Kinkiizi, and people are dying.

The government health facilities are very inadequate, short of medicines, equipment and staff. With levels of poverty exacerbated by the lockdowns (they are currently in another six weeks at least, of churches, schools and markets closed), many folk cannot afford to get treatment from the non-government run hospitals.

If anyone felt able to donate even a small amount to an emergency Covid fund for medical treatment the poorest in Kinkiizi could access, that would be amazing and we could at least help some people to get treatment that could save their lives. The fund will be administered in Kinkiizi by Diocesan staff.

Please also keep Kinkiizi Diocese in your prayers as they grapple with Covid and trying to access vaccinations. Uganda have so far only been able to vaccinate around 1% of their population and have now run out of vaccines.

Please pray for the vaccines to be shared across the world more fairly. Thank you.

.... equipping you to share God's life

What is the Bishop's Commission for Mission?

BCM is a lay training programme focused on enabling church members to live missionally in every part of their lives, equipping them to live out their vocation to the full. It is not an academic training programme, instead through participating in the programme, we believe God will shape you for your place in his mission. If you successfully meet the programme requirements, you will be commissioned by the Bishop of Winchester at the annual Lay Ministries Service at Winchester Cathedral for a BCM role within your benefice as agreed between you and your incumbent.

How does BCM training work?

This autumn we hope to offer BCM programmes as a combination of online and in-person training. Topic sessions are led by passionate practitioners in their field. BCM highly values relational learning – we believe everyone comes with wisdom and experience to share, so we ask you to commit to attending all the sessions and to engage with the online material offered.

Prior to each of the sessions there is pre-work material to do online at your own pace and in your own time. We expect this to take up to an hour. This is a key aspect of BCM and we expect everyone to do it. Pre-work material may consist of something to read, a film clip to watch, commenting in a forum, journaling, or engaging in practical actions to explore offline.

Session Information

- There is a morning **Launch Session** at St Barnabas Church in Weeke, Winchester, which introduces Mission Spirituality for all programme streams together.
- There are then **6 specialist topic sessions** (1.5 hours each) when individual streams meet online together for discussion and tutor input.
- Finally, there is a **Closing Session** at Wolvesey, Winchester, for all programme streams together again to enable you to consider how God has been shaping you for His service.

What other requirements are there for BCM training?

You will need to be recommended by your incumbent and PCC, who should pay your training costs, currently £60 per person.

Once you have completed the programme you will need to complete a role description, all levels of safeguarding training and a DBS check in order to receive your commission. More information will be provided during the training.

Which programmes are we offering this autumn?

- **BCM Worship:** This is for those who have a desire to lead God's people into God's presence. The training will cover the core skills required to lead worship in your church/community and on completion carries an authorisation to lead non-eucharistic worship more than once a quarter.

- **BCM Youth & Children's Ministry:** This is primarily for those who are leading any form of youth or children's ministry in the church. The training will explore faith development in children and provide you with a range of creative ideas for building a strong ministry team.

- **BCM Prayer Champions:** This aims to equip you to encourage prayer in your church and community. It will build your personal confidence in prayer and offer you a variety of ideas to help others grow in prayer.

- **BCM Creation Care:** This is for those who want to help their church steward the world's natural resources. It will consider the theology of our calling to care for God's creation, as well as exploring practical actions.

Rule of Life Workshop

There is also an optional Rule of Life for BCM Workshop with Revd. Sally Dakin, open to all programme streams on 8th September 7.30-9.30pm. (Limited places)

What is it like to take part in a BCM?

"I have been fortunate to take part in two BCM streams, Pastoral, and Prayer Champions. One held in person the other online. It was a wonderful opportunity to meet with fellow Christians who are interested in the same areas, to work together to not only learn more about the subject and grow in fellowship, but also to also develop my own faith.

Although the BCM streams are not a qualification, the training and confidence they give you are invaluable. Lay leadership is still regarded by many as a new concept, we all struggle with feelings of inadequacy, and the BCMs do change that, growing your confidence.

Age is no limit. If you are interested in any of the BCMs available, go for it."

Overall it has been a great year, God has been moving in the lives of our young people and it is been wonderful to see them deepen their relationship with God.

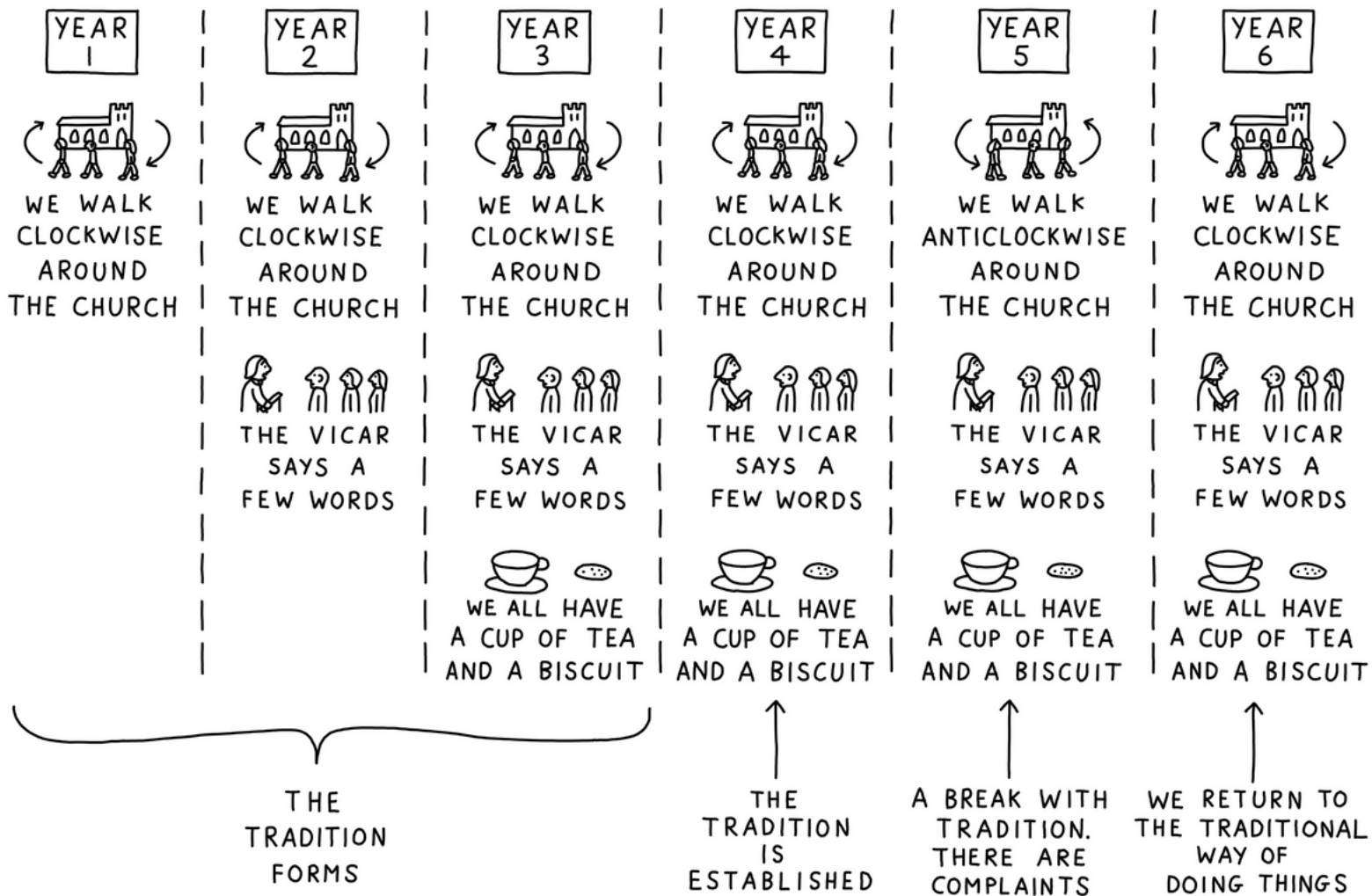

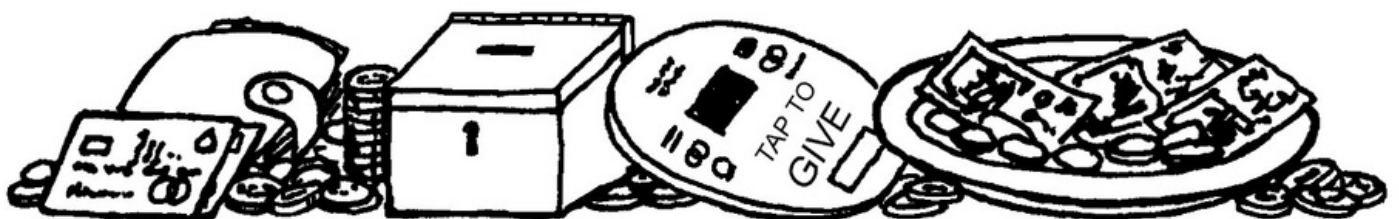

SCAM WARNING

We have received a warning about the following scam where people are targeting church members;

Both people had recently published their contact details in the church Newsletter, which is available to view on the website. It seems likely somebody is trawling the church website looking for people's contact details, and then creating email and phone accounts in the Ministers name in an attempt to scam them.

A church member received an email which showed up as being 'from' the Minister. He had no reason to suspect that it was not from the Minister, as they have email contact about all sorts of church matters. He opened the email. It asked him if he was available, because the sender needed a favour, and was signed by the minister. Still unsuspecting he replied and then received a response asking him to go to a shop and purchase a Google Play card, claiming that the sender had forgotten their niece's birthday and it was urgent.

He became suspicious, then noticed that the grammar and punctuation were poor. He, therefore, did not respond but alerted the Minister.

The email address the messages had been sent from, and it was not the Ministers. Instead, it was from the email address: office 23127@gmail.com.

A few days later the Minister was contacted by another Member, to ask if she had just texted her.

The sender signed as the Minister. claimed to be in a meeting, but to need a

favour. She replied to the first message, and was then asked to go to a shop and buy a Google Play card. But was given a different reason. She was told that the card was needed for a woman who was in hospital battling cancer.

The phone number from which the texts were sent was 07451 200598.

Rest assured our ministry team would never approach members of our church family in this manner. Please be vigilant and let us know immediately if you receive anything similar.

DOUBTING THOMAS JULY 3RD

If you have ever doubted aspects of your Christian faith, St Thomas is the saint for you. His feast day is on 3rd July.

Thomas, one of Jesus' 12 disciples, was deeply devoted, but also very honest whenever he got confused. When Jesus spoke of going to his Father (John 14), Thomas was not afraid to ask Him where His Father was. As for the Resurrection, that really baffled Thomas. He demanded to see the risen Jesus for himself - and touch the wounds in His hands and feet. When Jesus appeared, Thomas' immediate response was one of worship: "My Lord and my God" (John 20).

Thus, Doubting Thomas' honest doubts, turned to honest faith, have become a reassurance for thousands of us down the centuries who also sometimes doubt Jesus. In Doubting Thomas' complete affirmation of faith, after meeting the risen, crucified Christ, we can find support for our own faith in Him.

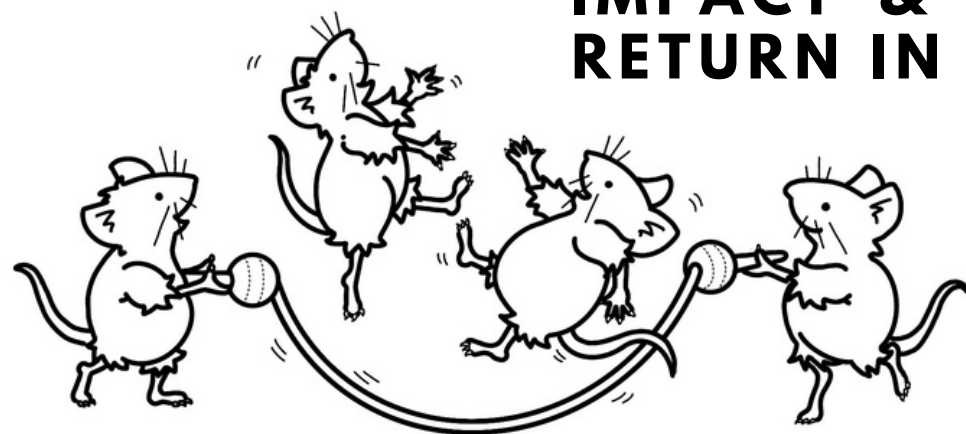

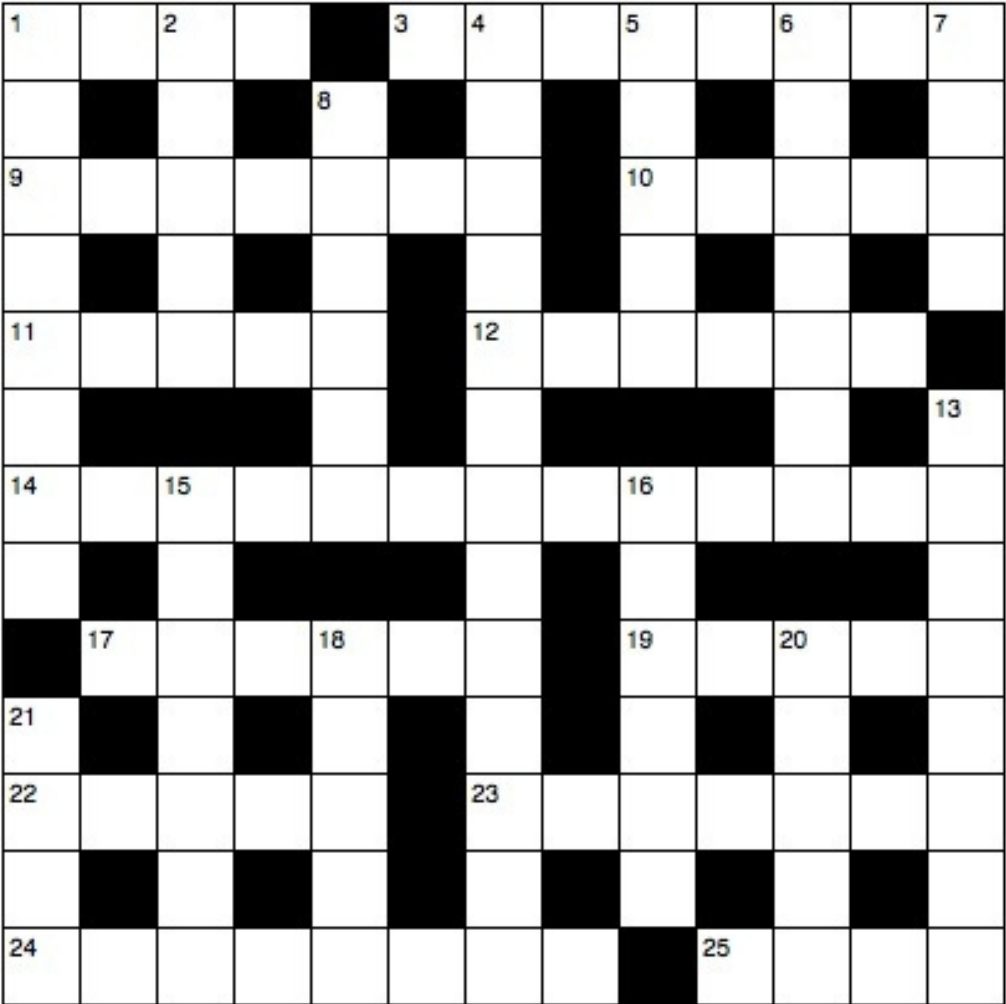

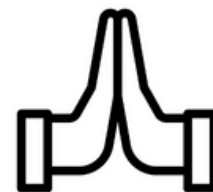
