Reactions from discussions

1. Feeling responses

Frustration at the fear for the future; We want the Church to stop worrying about the future and get on with it; To renew a sense of mission; Despair: A decade of no change? Frustration: so long to take decisions and act; Passionate about waiting to respond to despair; Hopeful: that the spirit will be with us; Challenged: for us to take our actions; Optimism; Not complacent; We feel despondent but not surprised about the numbers & how quickly they drop; Depressed; Frustrated; Optimistic; Opportunity; Exciting; Overwhelmed; Depressed; Worried; De-energised; Tired; Unsurprised; Frustration; Uncertainty; Shocked that lay readers are under used; Splintered; Help!; Overwhelmed; Frustration; Time; Feeling valued; Frustration at not knowing what is possible now; Exciting; Hopeful.

2. Thinking responses

Do not **nurture** our congregations enough, so **do more! Use** mission shaped ministry appropriate to each distinct congregation/parish; **Avoid** bureaucratic & procrastinatory responses, be spiritual; (Can you really have 6 priorities?); Don't loose/dissipate energy! Increase budget for training stipendiary clergy; Re-assess use of buildings and their viability; **Focus** on solutions; **Plan** for action now; **Listen, converse** and learn from others; Local Ministry development with **clear direction** from new Bishop; Prayer; Local response needed; Every parish is different and needs to respond differently to mission; **To be clear why** we want people to come to Church; Money? Numbers? Introducing people to the Kingdom? Difference between urban & rural; Welcoming new people carefully so they do not feel unwelcome; We need to take responsibility for leaving the 'doing' bit to other people; Maybe we are all waiting for someone else to 'start'; Enthusiastic investment in Local Ministry Development & Reader Ministry; Empowering people; "Getting a grip"; Using the talents of people in church; There is a need to have a wide debate about the meaning of the word "Ministry"; We have to move forward in hope and trust; We need to **develop a vision** of what the Church could be like in 10-20 years.
