Some Facts about St Luke's Church, Grayshott

- The church was built in the 'English Gothic' style and made of locally sourced Bargate stone.
- The foundation stone was laid on 30 July 1898 and the first service was held on Sunday 17 September 1899 even though the interior of the church was not fully completed.
- Edward Blakeway I'Anson was the architect of the church. His father, Edward I'Anson, was also an architect and well known for buildings like the museum and library at St Bartholomew's Hospital in London.
- The internationally famous writer, Arthur Conan Doyle built a house for himself and his family in Hindhead (Undershaw) and that is why Louise his first wife, Kingsley his son and Mary Josephine his mother are buried in the churchyard.
- During the first world war, the church bell was rung at noon each day as a signal for villagers to remember 'the men who were fighting their country's battles'.
