Psalm 104: v1 & 10 - 26:

- ¹ Praise the Lord, my soul. Lord my God, you are very great;
you are clothed with splendour and majesty.
- ¹⁰ **He makes springs pour water into the ravines;
it flows between the mountains.**
- ¹¹ They give water to all the beasts of the field;
the wild donkeys quench their thirst.
- ¹² **The birds of the sky nest by the waters;
they sing among the branches.**
- ¹³ He waters the mountains from his upper chambers;
the land is satisfied by the fruit of his work.
- ¹⁴ **He makes grass grow for the cattle,
and plants for people to cultivate
– bringing forth food from the earth:**
- ¹⁵ wine that gladdens human hearts,
oil to make their faces shine,
and bread that sustains their hearts.

- ¹⁶ **The trees of the Lord are well watered,
the cedars of Lebanon that he planted.**
- ¹⁷ There the birds make their nests;
the stork has its home in the junipers.
- ¹⁸ **The high mountains belong to the wild goats;
the crags are a refuge for the hyrax.**
- ¹⁹ He made the moon to mark the seasons,
and the sun knows when to go down.
- ²⁰ **You bring darkness, it becomes night,
and all the beasts of the forest prowl.**
- ²¹ The lions roar for their prey and seek their food from God.
- ²² **The sun rises, and they steal away;
they return and lie down in their dens.**
- ²³ Then people go out to their work, to their labour until evening.
- ²⁴ **How many are your works, Lord!
In wisdom you made them all;
the earth is full of your creatures.**
- ²⁵ There is the sea, vast and spacious,
teeming with creatures beyond number
– living things both large and small.
- ²⁶ **There the ships go to and fro,
and Leviathan, which you formed to frolic there.**
