# National Review of Reader Ministry

## Background:

- Report of the Lay Ministries Working Group 2015/2016
- Focussed attention on nationally licensed, locally authorised and locally commissioned lay ministry in the CofE.
- Focussed also on funding of, vocations to, and types of lay ministries.
- Bishop Martyn Snow appointed 2017 as new chair of the Central Readers Council (CRC)
- Bishop Martyn (+M) produced a consultation paper 'The CRC what is God calling us to be and to do?'
- +M states 'lay ministry has changed rapidly in recent years , not the least in diversity' and as a result, 'a serious question has arisen over the future of Reader Ministry'

# National Review of Reader Ministry cont'd

Summary of 'What is God calling us to do' Consultation Paper:

1. Mission and Ministry in a changing world
2. Celebrating Diversity
3. The urgent task facing the CRC
4. 3 pressing needs in Church and Society
  - a) Re-imagining the church's engagement with wider society
  - b) Teaching the faith
  - c) Mentoring and Coaching



# National Review of Reader Ministry cont'd

Need to consider

- Role of CRC and its focus
- Equipping Readers to be enablers of mission
- Equipping Readers to be inspirational teachers of the faith
- Equipping Readers (experienced Christians) to be skilled mentors/coaches for others
- Implications for Reader Training

Each Diocese invited to send 5 representatives to a meeting for discussion the paper in March 2018

# National Review of Reader Ministry cont'd

## Response of Liverpool Diocese

- Warden of Readers prepared an Executive Summary on the Consultation paper for information and also to consider the following:
  1. Determine what response, if any, should there be to the consultation paper
  2. Determine, if required, who should represent the Diocese at the Regional Consultation meeting in March 2018
  3. Determine, if agreed, the lead person/group if the diocese is to be involved in this project
